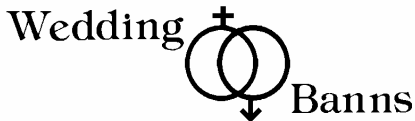

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“PASTORAL PONDERINGS...”

Several weeks ago I joined some of our Young Neighbors In Action who were going to My Brother's Table to assist in serving dinner to about three hundred people in need. I heard about the Table but I had never been there before. Upon entering the building I was immediately impressed at how well taken care of the building was. It was exceptionally clean. The tables and chairs were very well organized, The kitchen was very professional as were the Chefs who prepared the meal and there were many volunteers who generously assisted the guests who came for dinner. I was very inspired by all that was happening and grateful to God for his presence there through all the people that so generously give of themselves to feed the Hungry!!

I couldn't help but think of this experience when I read the Word of God that we receive this weekend during our celebration of the Eucharist. In The first reading from the Old Testament, Elijah commands that the man before him give the barley loaves he had brought with him to the people to eat. The man resisted but Elijah commands him again and the man gives it to them for Elijah said, "For thus says the Lord, they shall eat and there will be some left over."

In the New Testament Paul tells the Ephesians what must motivate them to care for others when he says, "live a life worthy of the call you have received, with all humility gentleness, and with patience, bearing with one another through love...."

In the Gospel Reading the apostles tell Jesus that there is a boy with them who has five barley loaves and two fish and Jesus tells them to get the five thousand people to recline. They do and Jesus multiplies the loaves and fish, the people eat and there is plenty of food left over!!!. All three readings teach us that our God is a generous God who constantly, lovingly, and faithfully feeds his hungry people through those who so lovingly and generously feed those in need at My Brother's Table and the many Tables like it throughout the entire world.

Take some time this week to think about the following:
Who are the people that have and continue to feed you on a daily basis, even if it is only yourself? Do you believe that the generosity of God's life and love is alive for you through these people?

Who are the People that you feed? Do you feed them with a spirit of Humility, gentleness and patience bearing with one another with love? Do you believe that when you are fed with the Word, Body and Blood of Christ your hunger for God in your life is satisfied?

OFFICE OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Although this year's celebrations have concluded...it's time to get ready for next year. Confirmation Candidates are especially invited to help the *Office of Religious Education*; bring a friend! This in no means excludes anyone who wishes to help; the projects are not difficult...just time consuming!

NEW FAMILY/FIRST TIME RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

If your child is entering the Religious Education Program, a form needs to be completed. You are most welcome to drop by the office during normal business hours (or by scheduling a mutually-convenient appointment.) Please bring a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate (if not celebrated at Saint Pius V). We have found that on-site "first-time" registration is a great service to our parish family.

The First Reconciliation/First Eucharist Program is a two-year program (inclusive of Grade One). If your child has not completed Grade One Program, we offer the "Rite of Christian Initiation Program (adapted for children). Please call the office if you have a question regarding this or any other program.

YOU ARE NEEDED – Is 2009/2010 the academic year you will give the gift of your witness to our children as they journey with Jesus? The "present of your presence is needed. Training and Catechist assistance is available. Won't you *please* consider spending *one hour with Jesus* and our children? The *entire Grade* cannot start until all Catechists for that Grade are in place.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION is available only on Sunday mornings from 10:00-11:10 AM. Children who are four may attend, even though they may not be attending Pre-Kindergarten in a public school. There is no tuition for "Pre-K". If you have *any questions* regarding your child's "eligibility", please contact the Office of Religious Education.

RE-REGISTRATION FORMS have been mailed, but are returning slowly. PLEASE help us and return the form today. Perhaps you know a family member, friend or neighbor who might not have returned the form yet. Your help will assist our planning for Catechists, classrooms, textbooks and supplies. **PLEASE RETURN THE FORM TODAY!** (*Tuition is not due until August 17th.*) If you are planning to move or are entering a Catholic School, please let us know, so that we may mark our records accordingly.

HALL MONITORS NEEDED – What can you do for one hour in service to our children? Simply be present during class time. When completing your registration form, please consider the "*present of your presence*" for our children. The Archdiocese of Boston requires all Hall Monitors (and all volunteers who have access to our children) to participate in the *Protecting God's Children* seminar (September date will be published in the bulletin).
