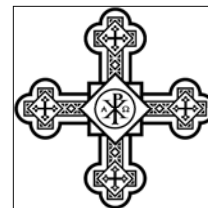

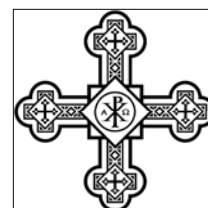

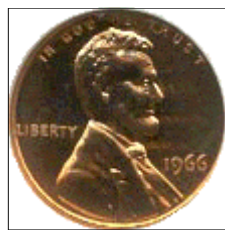

Lenten Regulations on Fast and Abstinence

This past Wednesday was Ash Wednesday and marked the beginning of Lent. The following fasting & abstinence regulations are observed:

- Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.
- Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- The special Paschal fast and abstinence are observed on Good Friday and, where possible, on Holy Saturday. On these days, Christians prepare themselves by these disciplines in anticipation of the renewal of their baptismal commitment on Easter.
- From its earliest days, the Church has urged the baptized and the catechumens to observe the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as a preparation for the celebration of Easter. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious, but failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.
- During Lent, the Church encourages attendance at daily Mass, self-imposed times of fasting, and generosity to local, national, and worldwide programs of sharing.



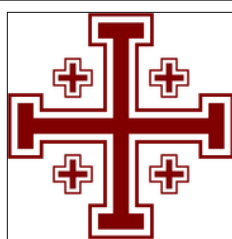
Operation Troop Support

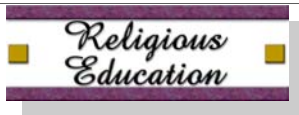

Repairs Needed to the Rodgers Electronic Organ:

We are told that if something is not done relatively soon the Organ at Blessed Sacrament Church may become inoperative! It is in serious need of repair. There are four issues: First, the eight speakers that provide the sound for the instrument are over twenty years old and are in a state of disintegration. There are other related issues with the speakers such as the proper power levels that will be needed with new more powerful speakers. Second, the main motor bearing on the organ's blowers which generates wind for the pipes is about the same age as the speakers and needs to be replaced. It makes more noise than the pipes! Third, the organ console itself needs normal maintenance, such as cleaning all contacts, replacement of light bulbs, replace all foam and felt guides, re-tensioning of the pedal keys, etc... Fourth, the organ pipes used to be centered on the rear wall of the Church, under the circular window. They were moved at some point to the side of the choir loft. The move was not in the best interest of the pipes or the quality of sound in the Church. They are off-center. To correct the sound issue and to make the appearance of the pipes more pleasing, as in the past, an apron will be built along the balcony railing. This apron will also house the speakers, removing them from the back wall. It should look better and sound better. The proposal for the work to be done by Marshall Ogletree Associates, Inc. (the same company that installed the organ originally) at a cost of \$20,850.00 was discussed and approved by the Finance Council of the Parish. Of course we had not planned for this major repair at this time. But it must be done. Hopefully it will be complete in time for Easter, the Parish celebrations of First Communion, and the weddings of the springtime.

Tuition Assistance: The Saint Vincent de Paul Society of the Archdiocese of Boston awards tuition assistance to students attending a parochial school (grades 1-8). These awards come from a trust set up in 1998. One hundred awards will be granted throughout the Archdiocese. Applications are available at the rectory. They must be filled out and returned by March 16th. Home visits to the applicants will occur during the next seven days. The Blessed Sacrament Saint Vincent de Paul Society must package each application with the home visit and have them in Boston before April 1st. 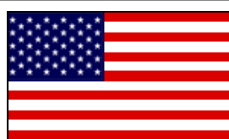

The New Creation By Dr. Scott Hahn

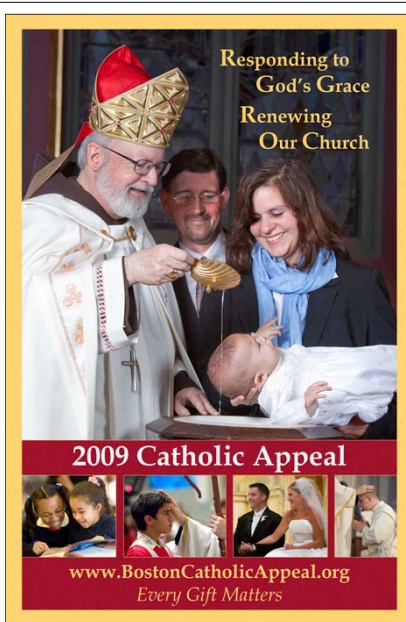
Lent bids us to return to the innocence of baptism. As Noah and his family were saved through the waters of the deluge, we were saved through the waters of baptism, Peter reminds us in today's Epistle. And God's covenant with Noah in today's First Reading marked the start of a new world. But it also prefigured a new and greater covenant between God and His creation (see Hosea 2:20; Isaiah 11:1-9). We see that new covenant and that new creation begin in today's Gospel. Jesus is portrayed as the new Adam - the beloved son of God (see Mark 1:11; Luke 3:38), living in harmony with the wild beasts (see Genesis 2:19-20), being served by angels (see Ezekiel 28:12-14). Like Adam, He too is tempted by the devil. But while Adam fell, giving reign to sin and death (see Romans 5:12-14, 17-20), Jesus is victorious. This is the good news, the "gospel of God" that He proclaims. Through His death, resurrection, and enthronement at the right hand of the Father, the world is once again made God's kingdom. In the waters of baptism, each of us entered the kingdom of His beloved Son (see Colossians 1:13-14). We were made children of God, new creations (see 2 Corinthians 5:7; Galatians 4:3-7). But like Jesus, and Israel before Him, we have passed through the baptismal waters only to be driven into the wilderness - a world filled with afflictions and tests of our faithfulness (see 1 Corinthians 10:1-4, 9,13; Deuteronomy 8:2,16). We are led on this journey by Jesus. He is the Savior - the way and the truth we sing of in today's Psalm (see John 14:6). He feeds us with the bread of angels (see Psalm 78:25; Wisdom 16:20), and cleanses our consciences in the sacrament of reconciliation. As we begin this holy season, let us renew our baptismal vows - to repent and believe the gospel.

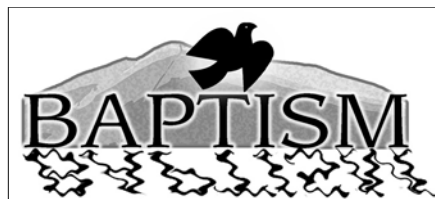
Novena of Grace in Lynn:

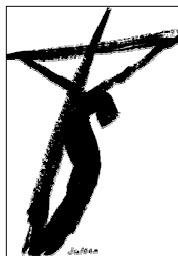
Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament:

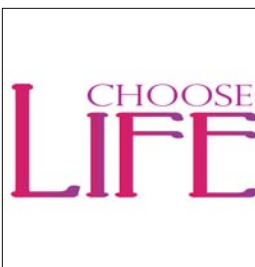
Rosary. You deserve the peace and quiet that come from being in the presence of the Lord.
