In Word & Deed

Prayer services, reflections and art often focus on the seven last words of Christ. These efforts try to capture the suffering and the agony of body and soul that Jesus experienced. In seven words we hear the intensity and the weight of the battle between evil and good, sin and grace, death and life. It is a solemn reflection on the difficulty of the spiritual life we lead as followers of Jesus.

If some focus on His seven last words, we might also focus on His seven most difficult words: Take up your cross and follow me. In that short sentence, all the faithful find their mission and purpose in life, given at Baptism and sealed in Confirmation. We follow Jesus. Trusting in His promises, accepting the Holy Spirit, and with a willing mind and heart, we take up our cross. It is the battle of faith, the power of hope and the glory of love. Through struggle, suffering and even

TO WALK AS ONE

A documentary about local veterans featured interviews with soldiers from World War II through the current wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. They were patriotic, wanted to serve their country and were proud of their service. They answered all kinds of questions about their experiences, and their memories of serving. When asked why they served, there was one answer they all seemed to have in common. Each veteran indicated that he had served for the sake of freedom and so someone else would not have to go to war.

Jesus is an example of selfless service. He is the suffering servant who bears our sins and dies for our sake. When we cannot help ourselves, Jesus steps in, giving His life for ours. Service for the sake of others is a selfless act of

Sign of Peace and Communion under Both Kinds: The Archdiocese has recommended that on Palm Sunday, March 28, we resume our normal way of offering the sign of peace to one another and, when it has been the custom to offer Holy Communion under both kinds, that is, under the forms of bread and wine.



The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick:

In the Letter of St. James we find the question: "Are there any among you who are sick?" St. James advises what should be done, namely, that "they should call for the priests of the Church and have them pray over the sick anointing them with

oil in the name of the Lord." This Anointing formerly called "Extreme Unction" or "The Last Rites," is not only intended for those near death but is for all the sick. We encourage you to request this sacrament when facing illness, prior to surgery or medical tests. Allow the Lord to come and comfort you and the prayer of the Church to strengthen you. This sacrament is a powerful sign of the love of God and the healing grace of Jesus.



Daily Mass: The 9:00 a.m. morning Mass is at St. Margaret's on Mondays, Tuesdays & Wednesdays and at Blessed Sacrament on Thursdays, Fridays & Saturdays. (This week however is Holy Week, and there is no morning Mass on Holy Thursday, Good Friday or Holy Saturday. There is Morning Prayer each of

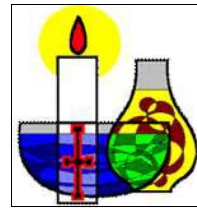

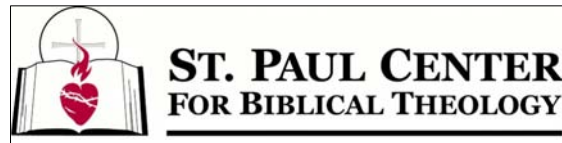

Passion of the Christ

What is written about Me is coming to fulfillment," Jesus says in today's Gospel (see Luke 22:37). Indeed, we have reached the climax of the liturgical year, the highest peak of salvation history, when all that has been anticipated and promised is to be fulfilled. By the close of today's long Gospel, the work of our redemption will have been accomplished, the new covenant will be written in the blood of His broken body hanging on the cross at the place called the Skull. In His Passion, Jesus is "counted among the wicked," as Isaiah had foretold (see Isaiah 53:12). He is revealed definitively as the Suffering Servant the prophet announced, the long-awaited Messiah whose words of obedience and faith ring out in today's First Reading and Psalm. The taunts and torments we hear in these two readings punctuate the Gospel as Jesus is beaten and mocked (see Luke 22:63-65; 23:10-11,16), as His hands and feet are pierced (see Luke 23:33), as enemies gamble for His clothes (see Luke 23:34), and as three times they dare Him to prove His divinity by saving Himself from suffering (see Luke 23:35,37,39). He remains faithful to God's will to the end, does not turn back in His trial. He gives Himself freely to His torturers, confident that, as He speaks in today's First Reading: "The Lord God is My help...I shall not be put to shame." Destined to sin and death as children of Adam's disobedience, we have been set free for holiness and life by Christ's perfect obedience to the Father's will (see Romans 5:12-14,17-19; Ephesians 2:2; 5:6). This is why God greatly exalted Him. This is why we have salvation in His Name. Following His example of humble obedience in the trials and crosses of our lives, we know we will never be forsaken, that one day we too will be with Him in Paradise (see Luke 23:42).
