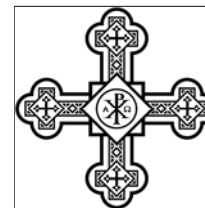

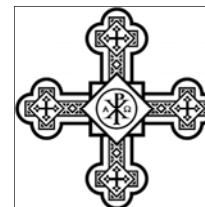

Daily Mass: On Wednesday, March 18, a group of Parishioners of both Blessed Sacrament and Saint Margaret Parishes met to prepare for the fact that beginning on Monday, April 13 there will only be one daily Mass in the community. The general consensus was that morning

Mass would continue to be at 9:00 a.m. with Mass being at Saint Margaret's on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and at Blessed Sacrament on Thursday, Friday and Saturday; that the rosary would be recited beginning at 8:30 a.m. each morning still leaving a period of quiet time prior to the beginning of Mass; that people of both Parishes would be invited to serve as Altar Servers, Lectors and Ministers of Holy Communion at either Church; that Holy Communion would be offered under both species, namely the Eucharistic Bread and Wine; that singing hymns would be welcome; and, that we would try this new plan for six months, then see how it is working out.

Announced Masses: Both Churches have a number of announced Masses that have been "booked." Martha at Blessed Sacrament and Carol at Saint Margaret's are in the process of rescheduling these Masses. We ask everyone's patience and understanding during this period of change and transition.

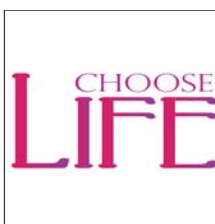

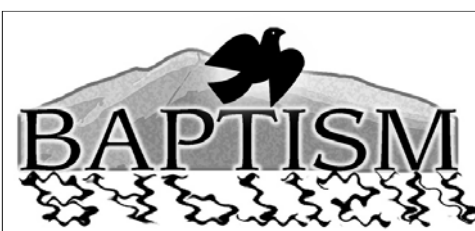

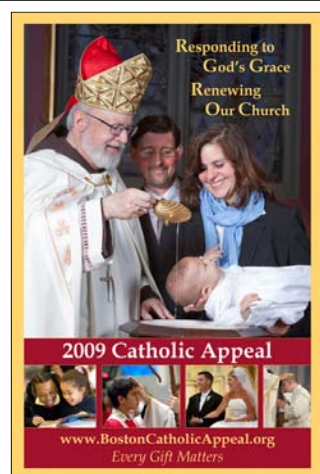

One of the great joys of the Easter season is the reception of First Holy Communion. This year we have 86 children preparing for the sacrament. These celebrations will be on the following dates and times:

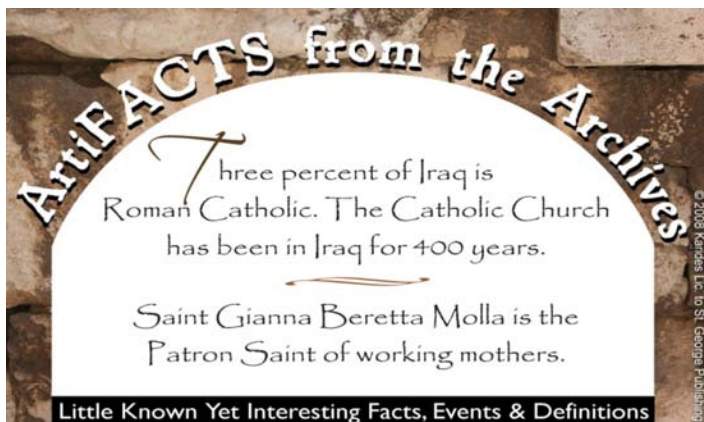

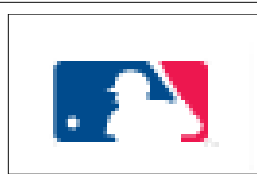
In Ireland, after the practice of Catholicism had been outlawed in the late 17th Century, families would place a candle in the window at Christmas, an invitation that a priest was welcome to celebrate a clandestine Mass in that home. The candle was also a symbol of welcome to the Holy Family, looking for a place at the inn.

Today, in the Archdiocese of Boston, Cardinal Seán has encouraged all Catholics to again use the candle as a symbol of welcome. If you are a non-Catholic, we invite you to learn more about Catholicism. If you are a Catholic who has been away from the faith, we would like to welcome you home. Yes, there is a place for you. St. Augustine, upon returning to the Church after some time away, addressed the Lord with the words, "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." If you are experiencing restlessness, Jesus can help you experience peace. Like St. Augustine, you can come home. The candle in the window is for you.

The opportunity to welcome others is one that belongs to Cardinal Seán, to our clergy and religious, and to all Catholics. Faith is a gift of God, a gift we have the honor of handing on. 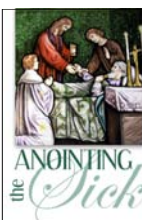

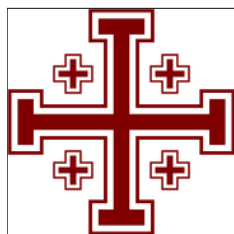

New Morning *By Dr. Scott Hahn*

The tomb was empty. In the early morning darkness of that first Easter, there was only confusion for Mary Magdalene and the other disciples. But as the daylight spread, they saw the dawning of a new creation. At first they didn't understand the Scripture, today's Gospel tells us. We don't know which precise Scripture texts they were supposed to understand. Perhaps it was the sign of Jonah, who rose from the belly of the great fish after three days (see Jonah 1:17). Or maybe Hosea's prophecy of Israel's restoration from exile (see Hosea 6:2). Perhaps it was the psalmist who rejoiced that God had not abandoned him to the nether world (see Psalm 16:9-10). Whichever Scripture it was, as the disciples bent down into the tomb, they saw and they believed. What did they see? Burial shrouds in an empty tomb. The stone removed from the tomb. Seven times in nine verses we hear that word - "tomb." What did they believe? That God had done what Jesus said He would do - raised Him up on the third day (see Mark 9:31; 10:34). What they saw and believed, they bore witness to, as today's First Reading tells us. Peter's speech is a summary of the gospels - from Jesus' baptism in the Jordan to His hanging on a tree (see Deuteronomy 21:22-23), to His rising from the dead. We are children of the apostles, born into the new world of their witness. Our lives are now "hidden with Christ in God," as today's Epistle says. Like them, we gather in the morning on the first day of the week - to celebrate the Eucharist, the feast of the empty tomb. We rejoice that the stones have been rolled away from our tombs, too. Each of us can shout, as we do in today's Psalm: "I shall not die, but live." They saw and believed. And we await the day they promised would come - when we, too, "will appear with Him in glory."

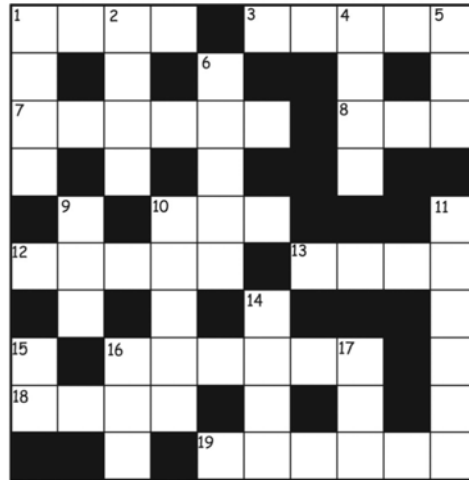
