Pastoral planning, the reflection and preparation that allows us to carry out the Church's mission well, is one of the most significant priorities of the Archdiocese and the Universal Church. It is a process that must take place during every age and within every climate, but it is particularly important that it take place in times of great change, such as these. As we look at the aging and shortage of priests, the population shift from cities to suburbs, and the condition of churches and schools built years or even centuries ago, we must thoughtfully consider how to best meet the pastoral needs of the people of God.

The tools of the pastoral planning process are both practical and spiritual. Parishes and Archdiocesan staff are working together to assess the best use of resources and to propose new ways of organizing. Collaborative efforts among parishes will be key to enhancing the effectiveness of pastoral care. We also seek to renew the spirit of the baptized as we respond to Pope John Paul II's call to bring the Gospel to all people in a way that is new in “ardor, methods and expression.” And we hope to inspire an increased commitment to the giving of time, talent and treasure. For it requires the efforts of laity and clergy together to carry out Christ's work on earth.

Pastoral planning involves change, change made for the sake of growth that will strengthen us as we continue our work in mission, sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ.

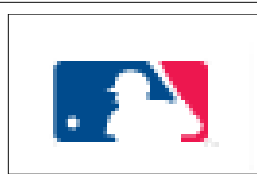
Blessed Sacrament 8th Grade & High School

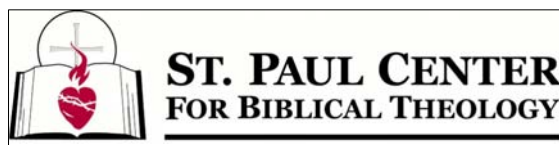

On the Vine

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that He is the true vine that God intended Israel to be - the source of divine life and wisdom for the nations (see Sirach 24:17-24). In baptism, each of us was joined to Him by the Holy Spirit. As a branch grows from a tree, our souls are to draw life from Him, nourished by His word and the Eucharist. Paul, in today's First Reading, seeks to be grafted onto the visible expression of Christ the true vine - His Church. Once the chief persecutor of the Church, he encounters initial resistance and suspicion. But he is known by his fruits, by his powerful witness to the Lord working in his life (see Matthew 7:16-20). We too are commanded today to bear good fruits as His disciples, so that our lives give glory to God. Like Paul's life, our lives must bear witness to His goodness and mercy. Jesus cautions us, however, that if we're bearing fruit, we can expect that God will "prune" us - as a gardener trims and cuts back a plant so that it will grow stronger and bear even more fruit. He is teaching us today how to look at our sufferings and trials with the eyes of faith. We need to see our struggles as prunings, by which we are being disciplined and trained so that we can grow in holiness and bear fruits of righteousness (see Hebrews 12:4-11). We need to always remain rooted in Him, as today's Epistle tells us. We remain in Him by keeping His commandment of love, by pondering His words, letting them dwell richly in us (see Colossians 3:16), and by always seeking to do what pleases Him. In everything we must be guided by humility, remembering that apart from Him we can do nothing. As we sing in today's Psalm, we must fulfill our vows, turning to the Lord in worship, proclaiming his praises, until all families come to know His justice in their lives.

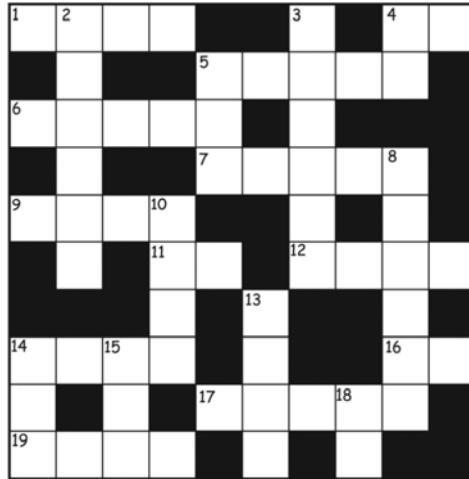
