TO WALK AS ONE

A famous saying, used in politics and religion, says “Don’t listen to what I say, watch what I do.” It’s the opposite of another proverb, “Do as I say, not as I do.” Actions do indeed speak louder than words. What we do and how we act, especially when we think no one is watching, says more about our values and beliefs than any profession of faith, hope or love.

For a good idea to become a value, it has to move from the mind and heart to the hands and feet. It has to change our behavior and become visible by what we do. Generosity is not real until we give; faith is not real until we pray; kindness is not real until we treat others well.

It is a combination of example, practice and teaching that gives kids a concrete grasp of what it means to be a kind and loving Christian.

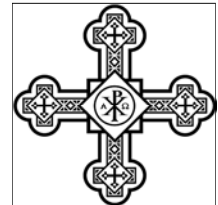

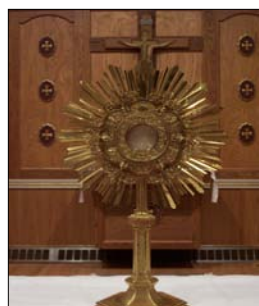

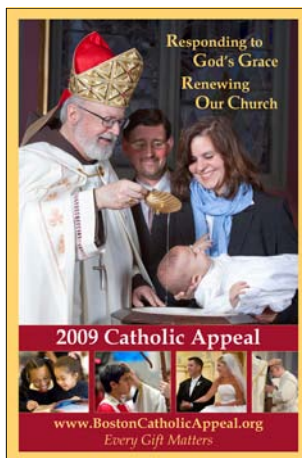

101 donors have contributed or pledged \$15,521.00 which is 72.2% of the Parish

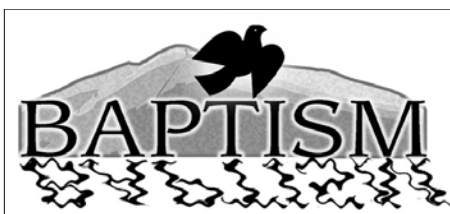

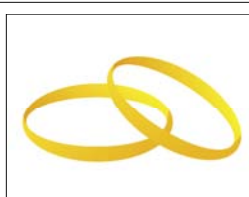

Mary Ann Glendon, the Harvard Law professor who was U.S. ambassador to the Vatican from 2007 until earlier this year, has announced that she will not accept the University of Notre Dame's Laetare Medal or participate in the university's May 17 commencement because of the school's invitation and conferral of an honorary degree on President Barack Obama.

President Obama's Commencement Address at Notre Dame University and his reception of an honorary degree from that University have sparked widespread controversy in the Catholic Community. I believe Mary Ann Glendon's letter to the President of Notre Dame which appeared in several newspapers is worthy of reprinting in our bulletin. It highlights what a Catholic University should be and why Notre Dame has failed in this regard.

This is the text of the letter addressed to Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., President of Notre Dame University:

Dear Father Jenkins,

When you informed me in December 2008 that I had been selected to receive Notre Dame's Laetare Medal, I was profoundly moved. I treasure the memory of receiving an honorary degree from Notre Dame in 1996, and I have always felt honored that the commencement speech I gave that year was included in the anthology of Notre Dame's most memorable commencement speeches. So I immediately began working on an acceptance speech that I hoped would be worthy of the occasion, of the honor of the medal, and of your students and faculty.

Last month, when you called to tell me that the commencement speech was to be given by President Obama, I mentioned to you that I would have to rewrite my speech. Over the ensuing weeks, the task that once seemed so delightful has been complicated by a number of factors.

First, as a longtime consultant to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, I could not help but be dismayed by the news that Notre Dame also planned to award the president an honorary degree. This, as you must know, was in disregard of the U.S. bishops' express request of 2004 that Catholic institutions "should not honor those who act in defiance of our fundamental moral principles" and that such persons "should not be given awards, honors or platforms which would suggest support for their actions." That request, which in no way seeks to control or interfere with an institution's freedom to invite and engage in serious debate with whomever it wishes, seems to me so reasonable that I am at a loss to understand why a Catholic university should disrespect it.

Then I learned that "talking points" issued by Notre Dame in response to widespread criticism of its decision included two statements implying that my acceptance speech would somehow balance the event:

- "President Obama won't be doing all the talking. Mary Ann Glendon, the former U.S. ambassador to the Vatican, will be speaking as the recipient of the Laetare Medal."
- "We think having the president come to Notre Dame, see our graduates, meet our leaders, and hear a talk from Mary Ann Glendon is a good thing for the president and for the causes we care about."

A commencement, however, is supposed to be a joyous day for the graduates and their families. It is not the right place, nor is a brief acceptance speech the right vehicle, for engagement with the very serious problems raised by Notre Dame's decision—in disregard of the settled position of the U.S. bishops—to honor a prominent and uncompromising opponent of the Church's position on issues involving fundamental principles of justice.

Finally, with recent news reports that other Catholic schools are similarly choosing to disregard the bishops' guidelines, I am concerned that Notre Dame's example could have an unfortunate ripple effect. It is with great sadness, therefore, that I have concluded that I cannot accept the Laetare Medal or participate in the May 17 graduation ceremony.

In order to avoid the inevitable speculation about the reasons for my decision, I will release this letter to the press, but I do not plan to make any further comment on the matter at this time.

CORNELIUS

The Acts of the Apostles tell us of the meeting between Saint Peter and a Roman centurion named Cornelius. At the time of the Apostles, the Jews were ruled by the Romans. The Romans stationed soldiers in the Jewish lands.

A centurion was an officer who commanded a "century" of soldiers, which was composed of about eighty men. The picture shows a centurion in armor.

Six centuries made up one cohort. We know from ancient inscriptions that there was an "Italian Cohort" in the Holy Land.

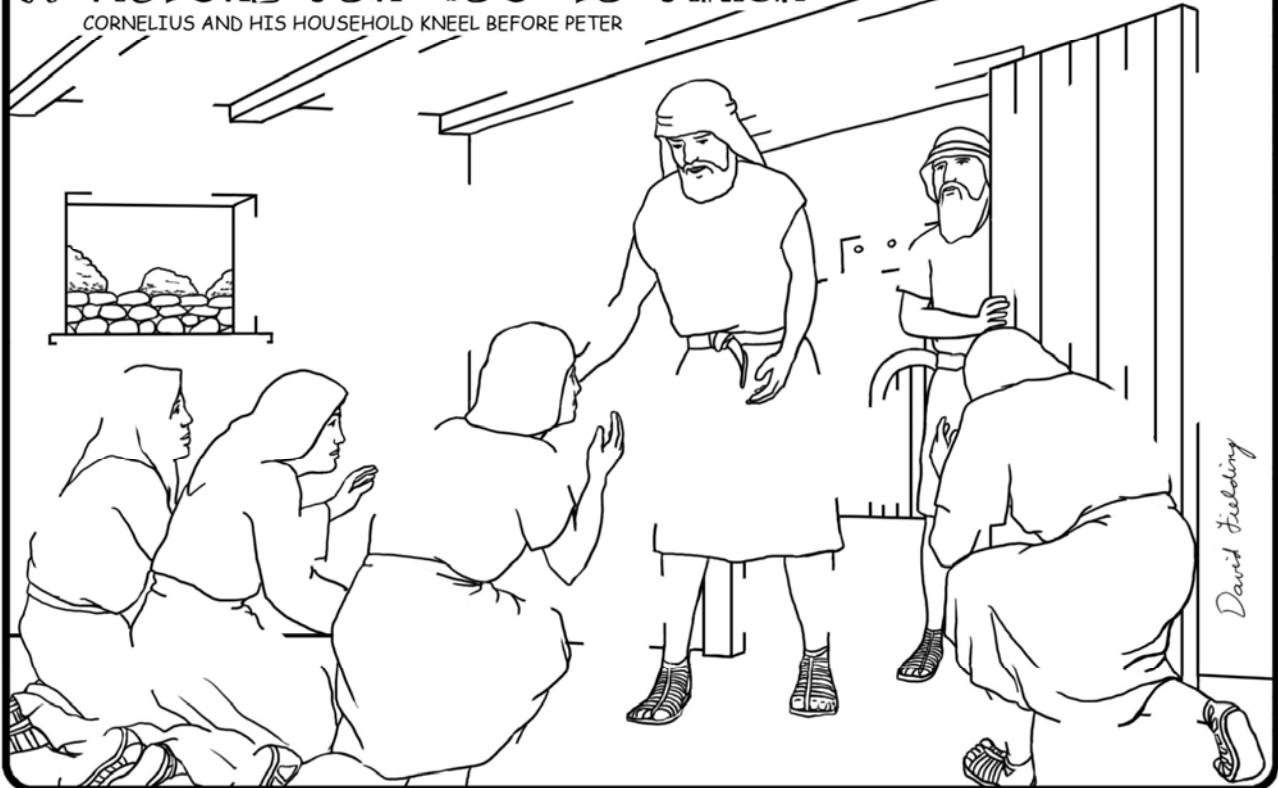
