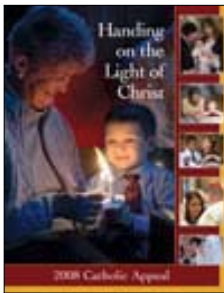

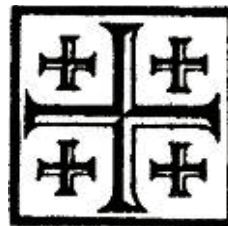

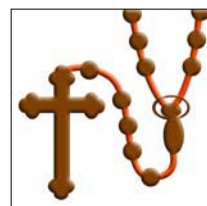

ST. PAUL CENTER FOR BIBLICAL THEOLOGY

Solid Rock By Dr. Scott Hahn

This Sunday's Gospel takes us to the end of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. Like Moses in this week's First Reading, Jesus climbed a mountain to deliver the Word of God's covenant to His people (Ex 24:12-18). This covenant Word requires a great deal from us. Far more than our simple hearing and acceptance of Jesus' "message." That's because the Gospel is not a philosophy, a set of good ideas for living. It is God's fatherly will for history. It is the good news of His kingdom, of the divine family He has come to create on earth in His Church. The Word of God comes to us as a call to the obedience of faith (Rm 16:26). We must take this Word to heart, letting it dwell richly within our souls (Col 3:16). We must allow ourselves to be led, to be guided by the Word that comes to us in His name. That's what we mean in this week's Psalm—when we sing of the Lord as our rock of refuge. Jesus also gives us this image of the solid rock. He promises that if we live by His Word we will have an eternal foundation to withstand the storms and trials of our lives. Jesus is the new Solomon, bringing us the Wisdom of God (1Kings 3:10-12). And like Solomon, he builds a house of God, a Temple, on a rock of foundation (1Kings 5:17; 8:27). Jesus is the Wisdom of God made flesh. The Church is the new household and Temple of God, built on the cornerstone of Christ (Lk 7:35; Eph 2:19-22). We will be judged by his Word. But this is not a matter of external works, as Jesus makes clear. That is Paul's point too in this week's Epistle. We must do the Father's will, which is our sanctification—knowing we've been justified, made right before God, by Christ's saving death (1Thes 4:3). It's this redemption, our expiation by His blood, that we celebrate and participate in this Eucharist.

Dear Friends,

Last weekend I traveled to Camp Becket-in-the-Berkshires, Becket, Massachusetts to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of CAMPS, a youth ministry program, that I had a share in beginning. Throughout these 25 years, CAMPS has welcomed thousands of youth in both the summer camp program for high school students and the winter edition for junior high students known as SnowCAMPS. CAMPS, an acronym meaning, Christ As My Personal Savior, describes the goal and purpose of the ministry: to invite youth into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, to grow in our faith through prayer and study and to live in Christian fellowship. It was a wonderful celebration for Staff members past and present, calling to mind the many grace-filled moments and lives changed through the power of prayer and faith. Jim, a former CAMPS Staff member, shared powerfully about his son and daughter and his desire for them to grow into mature and joy-filled Catholic adults (what father doesn't want this for his children?). By his family's involvement in CAMPS, both of his children have in recent years married people they met at CAMPS! This is not really that unusual. There have been many such weddings. In fact just this year I have been asked to officiate at two weddings of young people who met their future spouses at CAMPS. My prayer is that there be vocations to the priesthood also! When our bulletin encourages our teens to participate in CAMPS, the primary purpose is not that they find their future spouse(!) but that they build lives on **rock** (*not sand*) and "**rooted in Christ**," teaching them gospel values and truths.

Did you see the article in last week's "Pilot" highlighting the new Pastoral Team that will lead the two Parishes in our Town? On June 3, we look forward to welcoming Father Dan McCoy to Saugus. In writing about recent assignments of four Team Ministries in the Archdiocese, The Pilot described our Team as the most challenging one of all. I think the Pilot wanted to say that it was the assignment that was challenging and not the members of the Team! In any case, I ask your patience and prayers as we begin this new approach of Pastoral Ministry at Saint Margaret's & Blessed Sacrament.

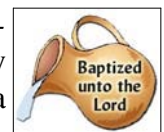

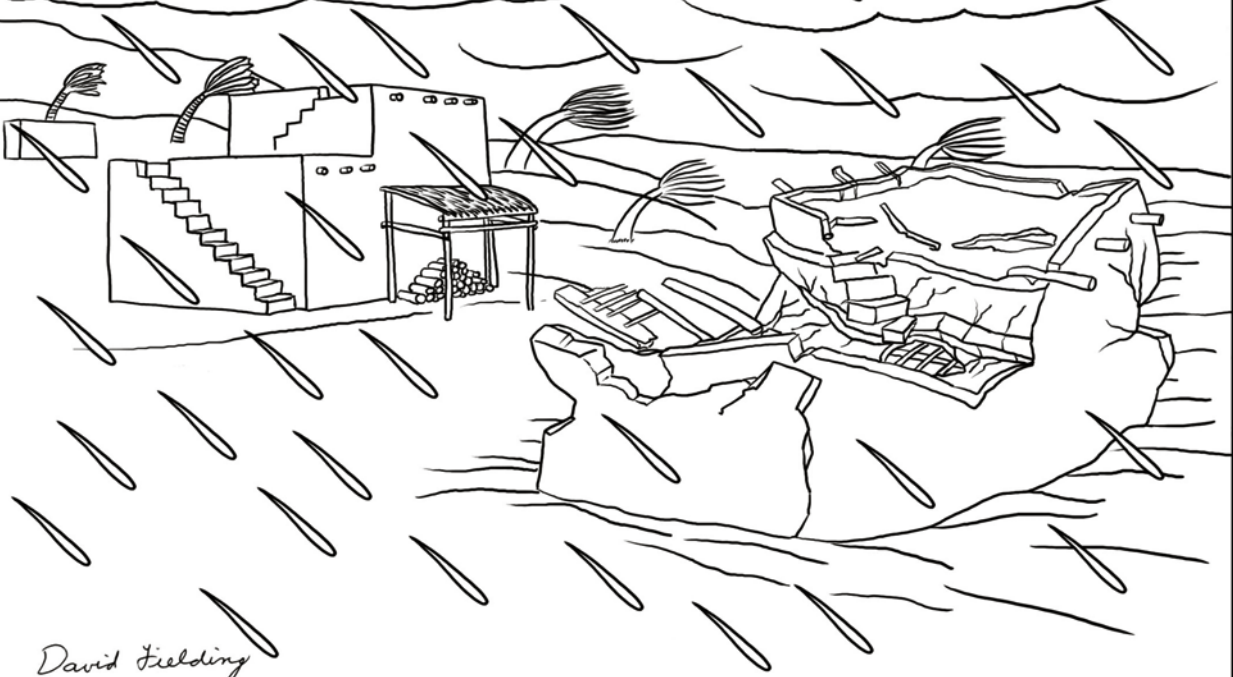
