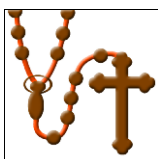

After the opening prayer of Mass they are led to the Parish Hall to hear the Word of God, to discuss what this means to them and to participate in a craft of activity then return to the assembly to participate in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

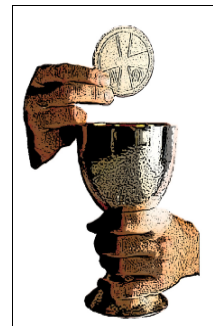
Mass Offerings: Beginning August 1, 2007, the Parish, with the consensus of the Parish Finance Council, is increasing the suggested offering for announced Masses. Announced Weekend Masses, namely the Masses offered on Saturday evening and on Sunday Morning will increase to \$25.00 and announced weekday Masses, namely Monday through Friday will increase to \$15.00. The suggested offering for a Funeral Mass will increase to \$400.00. It is important to note however that these are suggested offerings and that a Mass is never bought or purchased, that as such there is no cost for Mass. The offering given is for the support and maintenance of the Parish. Failure to arrive at the suggested offering will never prohibit Mass being offered for a worthy intention. It is also important to remember that a weekday announced Mass may have to be rescheduled in the event that a Funeral Mass is scheduled.

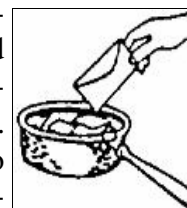

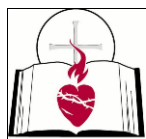

Harvest Time By Dr. Scott Hahn

Jesus has a vision in this week's Gospel - Satan falling like lightning from the sky, the enemy vanquished by the missionary preaching of His Church. Sent out by Jesus to begin gathering the nations into the harvest of divine judgment (see Isaiah 27:12-13; Joel 4:13), the 70 are a sign of the continuing mission of the Church. Carrying out the work of the 70, the Church proclaims the coming of God's kingdom, offers His blessings of peace and mercy to every household on earth - "every town and place He intended to visit." Our Lord's tone is solemn today. For in the preaching of the Church "the kingdom of God is at hand," the time of decision has come for every person. Those who do not receive His messengers will be doomed like Sodom. But those who believe will find peace and mercy, protection and nourishment in the bosom of the Church, the Mother Zion we celebrate in this week's beautiful First Reading, the "Israel of God" Paul blesses in this week's Epistle. The Church is a new family of faith (see Galatians 6:10) in which we receive a new name that will endure forever (see Isaiah 66:22), a name written in heaven. In this week's Psalm we sing of God's "tremendous deeds among men" throughout salvation history. But of all the works of God, none has been greater than what He has wrought by the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Changing the sea into dry land was but an anticipation and preparation for our passing over, for what Paul calls the "new creation." And as the exodus generation was protected in a wilderness of serpents and scorpions (see Deuteronomy 8:15), He has given His Church power now over "the full force of the Enemy." Nothing will harm us as we make our way through the wilderness of this world, awaiting the Master of the harvest, awaiting the day when all on earth will shout joyfully to the Lord, sing praise to the glory of His name.

Religious Education Registration: The following letter was mailed to all Parish households where children were registered in our Religious Education Program this past school year. We welcome new children and young people into our Program for the coming year: Grade 1 children, those new to the Parish, and Catholic High School Students preparing for Confirmation. Registration Forms and appropriate schedules may be obtained at the Rectory.

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian,

As we make preparations for our Religious Education Program for the next school year, we appreciate your cooperation in completing the enclosed Registration Form immediately.

Grades 1 through 6: Classes are on Sunday mornings from 8:30 to 9:45 a.m. at the Belmonte Middle School. A calendar of class dates is enclosed.

Grades 7 & 8: Classes are once a month at Saint Margaret's. See the enclosed calendar for class dates.

Year I Confirmation: Usually though not exclusively Grade 9 students, this group will now meet on Sunday afternoon from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m. in St. Margaret Parish Hall. See enclosed calendar for class dates.

Year II Confirmation: Usually though not exclusively Grade 10 students, this group meets together with their confirmation Sponsors on Sundays from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall. Those who attend Catholic High Schools should also attend. Catholic High Schools do not prepare their students for the Sacrament of Confirmation. See enclosed calendar for class dates.

Mass at 5:30 p.m.: On all Sundays when there is a Confirmation Preparation Class there will be a Mass at 5:30 p.m. for the Students. Parents and family members are always welcome to attend.

In order to prepare our class lists, register students Grades 1 through 10 using the enclosed form. Why not complete it right now! The Registration Fee for the coming year is the same as last year: \$60.00 per student with a maximum of \$75.00 per family. Please return by mail, in person at the Rectory or in the Collection basket when you are at Mass on the weekend.

Thank you for your cooperation in seeing that your children attend Religious Education classes each week. More importantly however is that you and your children attend Sunday Mass together. The worship of God is not only our great privilege but it is also a sacred responsibility. Hearing the word of God and participating in the Sacraments of the Church each week are the necessary food of the soul, without which we languish.

For young children up to those in grade 6, we offer The Liturgy of the Word for Children each Sunday morning (now through August 26) at our 10:00 a.m. Mass. This gives the children an opportunity to hear the Word of God in a way they can understand. Come and see what it is all about!

Also, Andrea Alberti, our Parish coordinator of Youth Ministry has a whole calendar of youth events for both Junior High and Senior High students. These events are all listed in the Parish Weekly Bulletin.

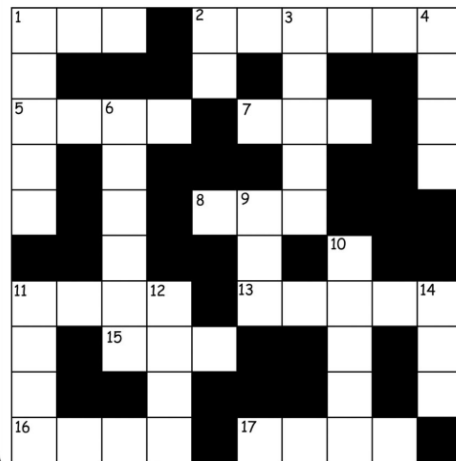

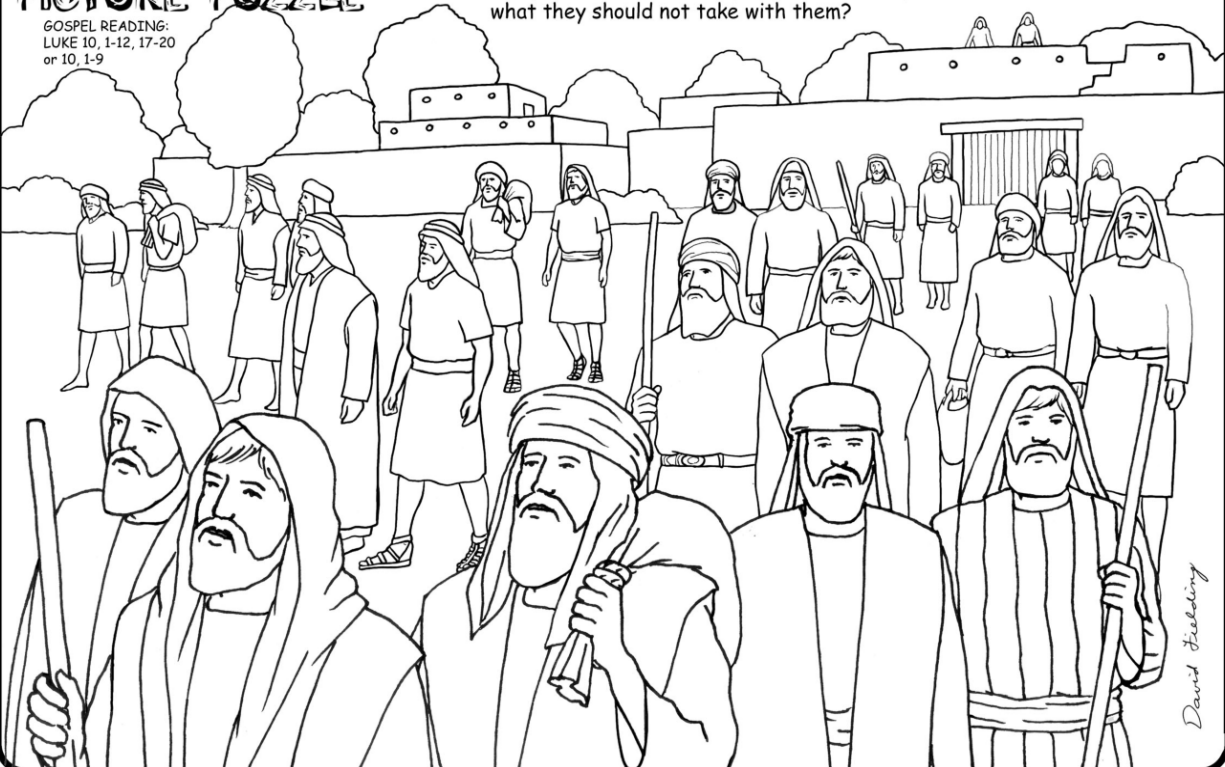
