### Religious Education

**Grades 1 through 6** continues this Sunday, September 18 from 8:30 a.m. until 9:45 a.m. at the Belmonte Middle School. Children entering the First Grade and children new to the Parish should register at the Belmonte Middle School on Sunday morning. Registration fee has not changed this year and is \$50.00 for one child with a maximum of \$65.00 per family. If this fee creates a problem, please let us know.

**Grades 7 & 8** meets monthly. The next monthly meeting is Friday, October 7, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

**Confirmation Year I** (usually 9th Graders though not exclusively) (Catholic High School Students are exempt) have class on Wednesdays from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

**Confirmation Year II** (usually 10th Graders though not exclusively) (Catholic High School Students are required to attend). The First Class for Students and Sponsors will be on Sunday, September 25 from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall.



**Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament:** On Wednesdays from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. you are invited to come and spend time in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Life is hectic and we are all busy. We have the perfect antidote: come and rest and bring all your hearts desires to the Lord present in the Eucharist.

**Join the Choir!** Choir rehearsals have begun on Thursday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Choir loft. Your voice is needed to enhance our community song, worship and praise of God. Visit Ben after Mass and speak to him about your becoming part of our growing choir.

**The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick:** In the Letter of St. James we find the question, "Is there anyone sick among you?" The response is that the sick are to call the priests of the Church who are to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. This Sacrament is not to be looked upon as the "Last Rites" but as a powerful instrument of God's healing and strength. Therefore, prior to surgery or when diagnosed with or living with a serious illness avail yourself of this gift. On the First Friday of October (October 7) this Sacrament is offered following the 9:00 a.m. Mass (unless there is a funeral) or at any time at your convenience. Call the Rectory to make arrangements.

**Is God calling you?** The Church needs you to serve the spiritual needs of God's people. Is God calling you to serve as a priest, deacon, sister or brother? If He is, call the Vocation Office of the Archdiocese (617-746-5949).

**The Sacrament of Baptism:** is usually celebrated on the third Sunday each month at 12 Noon. The Preparation Meeting prior to the Baptism of a child is every other month. Future Baptism Preparation meetings for parents & godparents are: October 6 & December 1, 2005, February 2, April 6, June 1, August 3, October 5 and December 14, 2006. Held in the Parish Hall, they begin at 7:00 p.m. Please call the Rectory (781-233-1040) to register.

**Stewardship:** Individually we may not feel that we can do much to help those in need. However, when we come together as a Church community, combining our many gifts, we can make a real difference. Thus, Saint Paul's advice is still so important for us today. We must stop thinking selfishly and learn the joy and the power of living faithfully and generously, united together in One Church.
