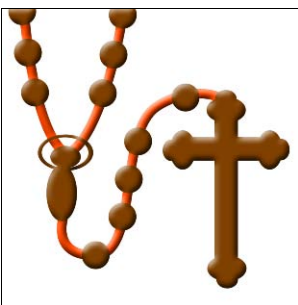

### The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick:

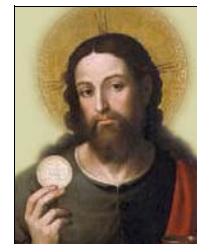
In the Letter of St. James we find the question, “Is there anyone sick among you?” The response is that the sick are to call the priests of the Church who are to pray over them anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. This Sacrament is not to be looked upon as the “Last Rites” but as a powerful instrument of God’s healing and strength. Therefore, **prior to surgery or when diagnosed with or living with a serious illness** avail yourself of this gift. At times we officiate at funerals where a person may have been seriously ill for a long time and no one made arrangements for them to go to Confession, receive the Eucharist and receive the anointing of the sick. Reach out to the sick with love. Please call to arrange a time for this sacrament to be administered to our sick.

### The Living Rosary Pilgrimage:

The next LRP will be Sunday, October 14 at 2:30 p.m. at Saint Mary’s, South Common Street, Lynn. We will begin with a procession with the Blessed Sacrament into the Church. ### **The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)**

is an ongoing process for those seeking to become members of the Catholic Church through Baptism or if one has been Baptized in another Christian Faith to be admitted into Full Communion in the Catholic Church. It also invites those who have been Baptized but have not received Eucharist and/or Confirmation to enter into the process and receive these sacraments. 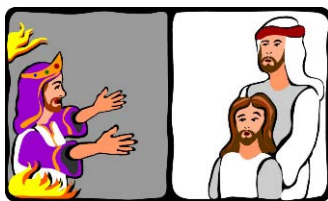

**St. Vincent de Paul Society**

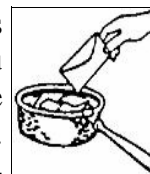

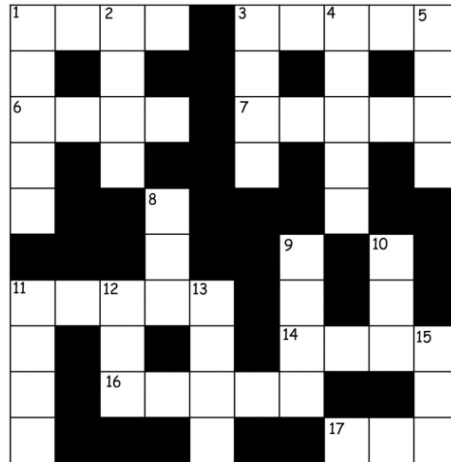
Your local librarian can help you find books with the answers. Your religion teacher might also help.
