**Grades 1 through 6** is on Sunday mornings from 8:30 a.m. until 9:45 a.m. at the Belmont Middle School. Children entering the First Grade and children new to the Parish should register at the Belmont Middle School on Sunday morning. Registration fee has not changed this year and is \$50.00 for one child with a maximum of \$65.00 per family. If this fee creates a problem, please let us know.

**Grades 7 & 8** meets monthly. The next monthly meeting is Friday, November 4, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

**Confirmation Year I** (usually 9th Graders though not exclusively) (Catholic High School Students are exempt) have class on Wednesdays from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

**Confirmation Year II** (usually 10th Graders though not exclusively) (Catholic High School Students are required to attend). The next Class for Students and Sponsors will be on Sunday, October 23 from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall.



**Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament:** On Wednesdays from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. you are invited to come and spend time in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Life is hectic and we are all busy. **Children's Choir:** Practice will start on Monday, October 10th, at 3:30 p.m. This group will be for children aged 7-14.

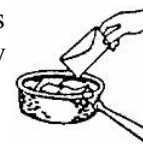
