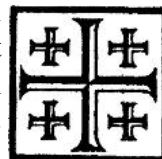


**Church Painting/Improvements:** Work has begun on a few improvements in the Church. To help the procession to Communion the first pew on either side will be removed; the St. Vincent de Paul poor boxes will be recessed into the wall; one confessional will be redesigned into a Penance Room and the other made into a storage unit; and for better access to the Penance Room and the new closet, the last pew will be removed. The Altar will also be elevated one step and the Tabernacle will be returned to the central location in the Sanctuary. The Tabernacle will be refurbished. Painting in the Church will begin on November 13. New rugs will also be installed. The lighting has already been improved as well as the emergency lighting system; new exits signs have been installed as well as new ones installed where needed. The Parish Hall is being painted, including repairing ceiling tiles that are damaged. Enclosing the pillars and adding wall lamps. This work may cause inconvenience especially with regard to weekday Mass and funeral Masses. We hope you understand. The Church has not been painted in over 25 years. It is your generosity to the Grand Annual Collection that makes this work possible.

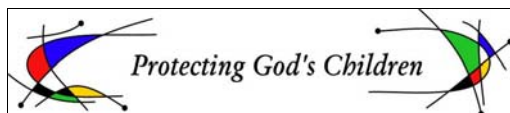

volunteer status. Protecting God's Children will be presented in the Parish Hall on Thursday, November 2 beginning at 6:30 p.m.

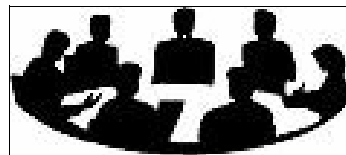

**A Letter to all the Faithful From the Bishops of Massachusetts**

Cardinal Seán P. O'Malley, Bishop George Coleman, Bishop Timothy A. McDonnell, Bishop Robert J. McManus request all Catholics to Call Their Legislators on the Marriage Amendment by November 9<sup>th</sup>.

The Massachusetts State Legislature must vote on H.4617, a proposed amendment to the state constitution defining marriage as the union between one man and one woman by the end of this year. The Senate and House are scheduled to meet in Constitutional Convention on Thursday, Nov. 9<sup>th</sup>, two days after the General Election, to take up all proposed amendments, including the Marriage Amendment. The help of Catholics and other concerned citizens is critical! Throughout our nation, and indeed throughout most of the world, marriage is defined as the union of man and woman, and this definition is treated as a matter of common sense, not bigotry. Traditional marriage policy protects the right of children to be raised by both a mother and a father and strengthens the family. The Marriage Amendment furthers these objectives and responds to the 2003 court decision in Massachusetts legalizing same-sex marriage. Opponents of the Marriage Amendment are urging legislators to boycott the Con-Con to deny the needed vote. If enough members walk out or fail to show up for debate on the 9<sup>th</sup>, a legislative vote will be prevented. The Marriage Amendment would die, thus thwarting the democratic process. This would deny the people their right to vote in 2008.

We renew our call for legislative approval allowing the people to vote on the Marriage Amendment. We ask Catholics and other concerned citizens to contact their legislators, urging their state senator and state representative to show up and vote to move the amendment forward on Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> or before the year's end. Your immediate action is imperative. The issue is not whether legislators support or oppose same-sex marriage, but whether the people have a say. We believe that in a democracy the people must be heard at the ballot on the fundamental question of marriage.

**IMMEDIATE ACTION STEPS REQUESTED**

Please call your state senator and state representative before November 9<sup>th</sup>. To reach each legislator by phone, dial the State House in Boston at 617-722-2000 and ask to be forwarded to the legislator's office. To send an email, go online to [www.voteonmarriage.org](http://www.voteonmarriage.org) and click on "Communicate." You will be quickly guided through a short series of steps to complete an email that will automatically be sent to your state senator and state representative.

Your message to your legislators can be as simple as the following:

"Hello, my name is \_\_\_\_, and I live at [give home street address and town]. I'm a constituent of Sen./Rep. [your legislator's name] and I'm calling to ask him/her to show up on Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> and to vote in favor of letting the people vote on H. 4617, the Marriage Amendment, in 2008. Please support Item #20 on the Con-Con calendar."

Also, please come to the State House in Boston on November 9<sup>th</sup> and show your support for traditional marriage and the people's right to vote at the 2008 ballot. Finally, pray for success on this critical vote.

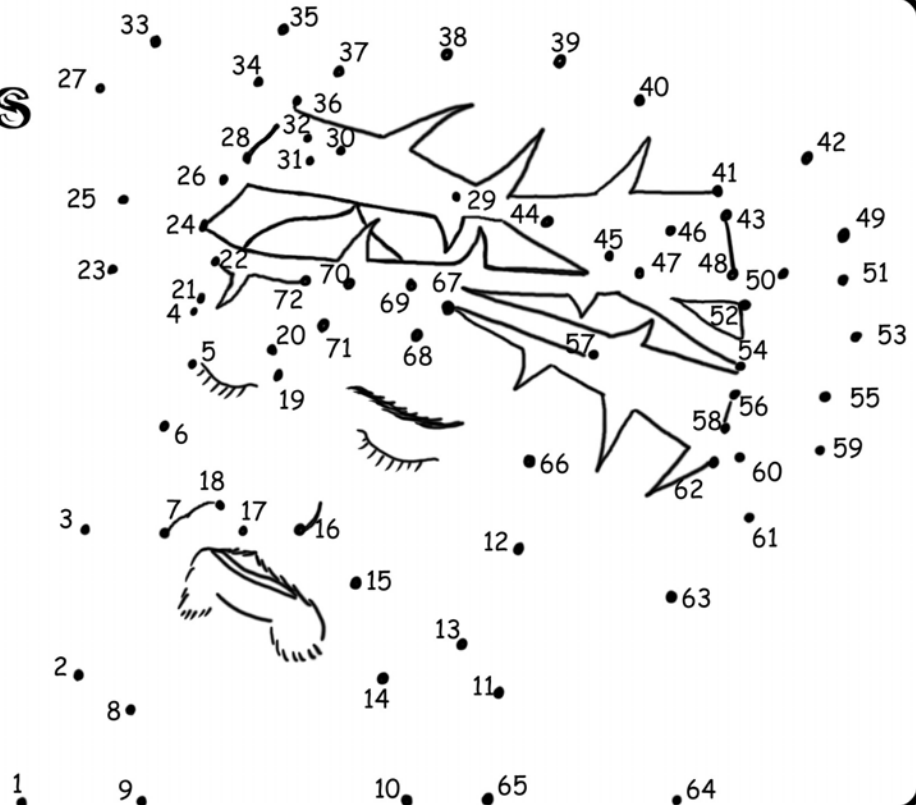
