

ST. PAUL CENTER FOR BIBLICAL THEOLOGY

All Souls

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

When St. Paul talked about the resurrection of the dead with the philosophers at Athens, many laughed and mocked him (Acts 17:32). The Gospel, he would later write, is “foolishness” to the wise of this world (1 Corinthians 1:18).

Yet this week’s first reading tells us that it is foolish to think that the souls of the just are dead. Instead, theirs is a “hope full of immortality.”

By His resurrection, Jesus frees the human race from the fear of death—from the terrible fear of the unknown, of our own disintegration—that holds us in a kind of slavery (see Hebrews 2:14-15).

Because He has walked the dark valley of death before us, because He has promised to walk alongside us, we can take “courage” and “fear no evil,” in the words of this week’s Psalm.

This is God’s will for us, the reason Jesus came into the world, according to Sunday’s Gospel: that we will recognize Jesus as the Son of God, and by believing in Him be raised to eternal life.

If we believe in Him, we will follow Him, as the Psalmist says: He will refresh our souls in the waters of Baptism, anoint our heads with the oil of Confirmation, and set before us the table of the Eucharist. There our cups will be filled to overflowing. And by these mysteries of His kindness and goodness, we will “dwell in the house of the Lord” in this life and in the life to come.

The First Reading seems to allude to the doctrine of Purgatory, to the souls of the just being chastised, purified as gold in a furnace and made worthy of God (see 1 Corinthians 3:11–12). This reading also tells us of the glory of the saints, who will share in the rule of Christ, judging and ruling over the nations (see Luke 22:30).

Through the “newness of life” we have in the sacraments, this week’s Epistle adds, we “grow into union with Him,” confident that we will be “united with Him in the Resurrection.”

SACRAMENT OF *Anointing* of the Sick

In the Letter of St. James, we find the question, "Are there any among you who are sick?" The answer that follows tells us that we are to call for the priests of the Church so they can pray over the sick and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord.

If you (or if you know of someone) are ill, been diagnosed with a serious illness, going into the hospital for tests or facing surgery, come and receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. In former times it was called the Last Rites but now the emphasis of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is the healing grace of Christ.

Pastoral Emergencies:

In an attempt to be available to the people of both Saugus Parishes especially in time of sudden illness, accidents or death, Father George and Father Dan have instituted an emergency phone service.

By calling **781-231- 4704** after hours (Rectory personnel usually leave the rectories in mid to late afternoon) or on weekends, your call will be forwarded to us.

Make sure to leave a detailed message (name, phone number, address, nature of the call) and we will respond as soon as we can.

Please also be aware that there is a priest on call 24/7 at every hospital of the area to serve Catholics in time of medical emergencies.

Do you know someone who is unable to come to Mass and who would appreciate receiving Holy Communion on a regular basis?



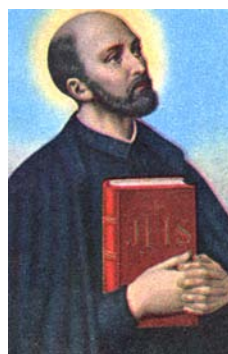



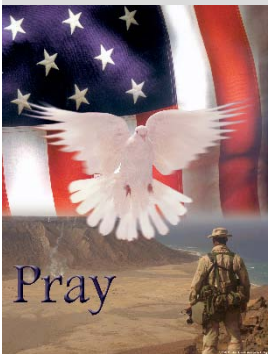

Drivers need to be at the church hall at 9:45AM to load cars. Delivery starts at 10:00AM.

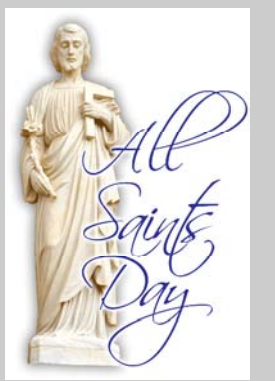

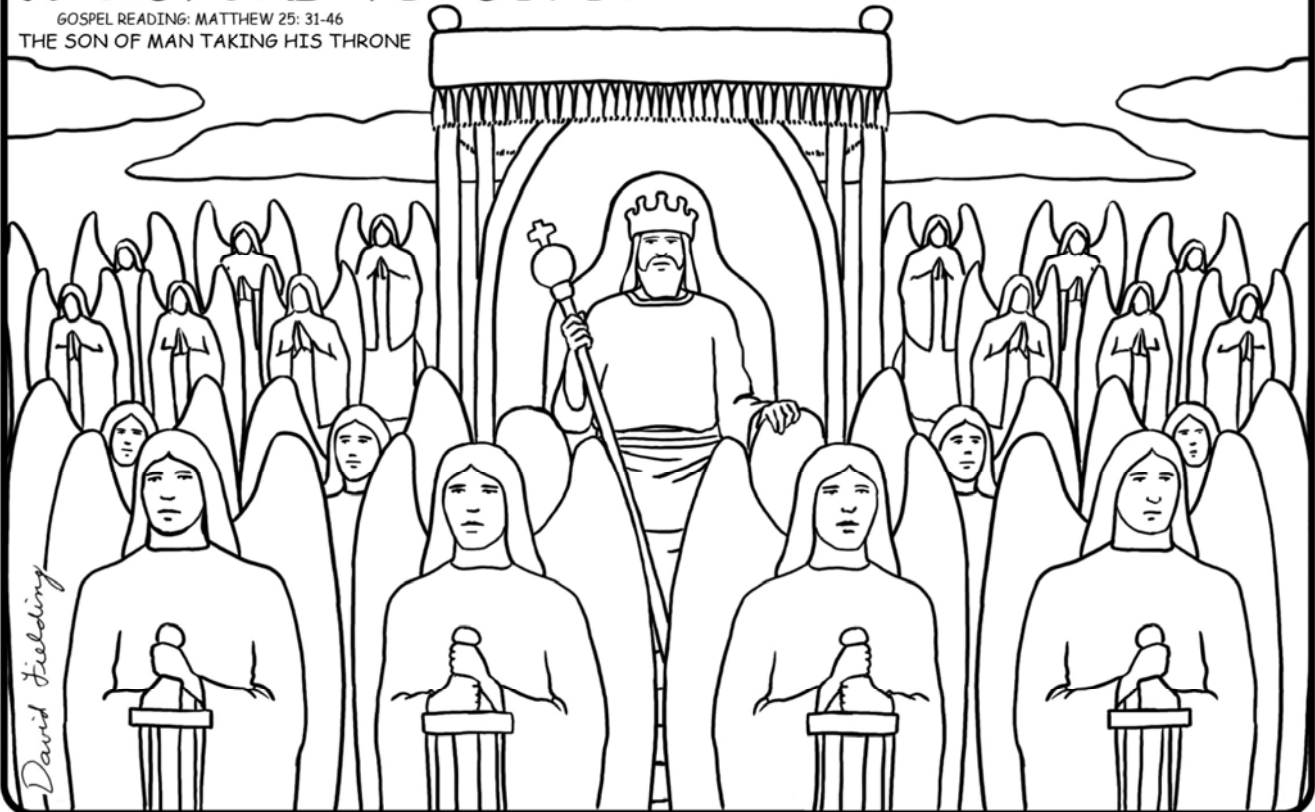
