**April 8 - Holy Thursday:** Morning Prayer at 9:00 a.m. (no morning Mass). At 7:30 p.m. the Mass of the Lord's Supper with the 'washing of the feet' will be celebrated. After Mass Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will continue until 10:30 p.m. concluding with night prayer. The collection taken up at this Mass will be for the Saint Vincent de Paul Society of our Parish.

**April 9 - Good Friday:** Morning Prayer at 9:00 a.m. The Good Friday Service at 3:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross will be at 7:30 p.m. The collection taken up at these services will be for the shrines in the Holy Land. Confessions will be heard after the 3:00 p.m. service.

**April 10 - Holy Saturday:** Morning Prayer at 9:00 a.m. The Easter Vigil will begin at 8:30 p.m. Please note that there is no 4:00 or 5:30 p.m. Masses on this day.

**April 11 - Easter Sunday:** Masses will be at 8:30, 10:00 & 11:30 a.m. The Easter collection is for the retirement needs and medical care of the priests of the Archdiocese of Boston. In their name I thank you for your generosity.

**The Sacrament of Reconciliation:** In addition to the regular time, (Saturday from 3:00 p.m. to 3:45 p.m.) Confessions will be heard on Good Friday after the 3:00 Service and on Holy Saturday from 9:30 to 11:00 a.m.

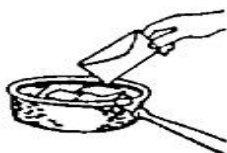

This Sacrament is not to be looked upon as the "Last Rites" but as a powerful instrument of God's healing and strength. Therefore prior to surgery or when diagnosed with or living with a serious illness avail yourself of this gift.
