By popular request: Ladies' Lenten Lead-in Luscious Lasserole
 4 chicken breasts, cooked and cubed
 3 cups cooked rice
 1 package chopped frozen broccoli
 4 chopped green onions
 1 can water chestnuts (chopped)
 1 can cream of chicken soup (can use two if you think it's needed)
 1 cup mayonnaise
 1 teaspoon curry powder
 3-4 cups sharp grated cheese

Combine soup, mayo, 2 cups grated cheese and curry powder in large bowl. Add chicken, rice, broccoli, green onions and water chestnuts. Mx all and season with salt and pepper to taste. Spread in 9 X 13 pan. Bake at 350 for about 30 minutes. Add remaining 1-2 cups cheese and cover with French fried onion rings and bake another 5-10 minutes (till cheese has melted and onion rings and crispy.) Enjoy.

Annual Catholic Appeal

Thanks to the 58 families in our parish that have responded to Annual Catholic Appeal. The parish has committed \$9,755 toward our goal of \$12,500. We hope to raise another \$2,745 and we have approximately 35 families that have not yet responded. Liturgical Questions

Sometimes I am asked questions about what the congregation is to do at a point in the Mass. Two years ago the General Instruction for the Roman Missal (the directions for the celebration of the Mass) was published by the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship. Almost immediately the American Bishops asked for one change and Cardinal George requested one clarification of these instructions. The American Bishops asked that in the United States the common practice during the Eucharistic Prayer is to kneel rather than to stand and this request was accepted. Then, Cardinal George asked the Congregation if it was required that all stand after communion. The response was that the congregation is not required to stand. In our parish, the original instruction was implemented before these changes were proposed and then granted. For the present, I want to make sure that parishioners know that they are not required to stand after communion until all have received communion. What is most important after communion is to pray and give thanks to God. Please choose a posture that is most helpful to you to pray after communion.

Next September, as we begin a new school year, I will give a detailed review of the General Instructions for the celebration of the Mass. At that time, any changes will be made so we will be in union with the whole Church in the US. Until then, I am confident that our community is reverently celebrating the Eucharist.
