Dear Pastor/Parish Administrator:

The right of pharmacists in Washington State to exercise their conscience when asked to dispense certain medications has been challenged. It is important for our people to receive clear guidance on this issue because it is presently focused on Plan B drugs, the so-called "morning after" pills, that are contraceptives, but in some cases may induce abortion.

In its defense of life the Church opposes the sale of Plan B drugs. Many pharmacists do not feel it is morally right to dispense this drug and claim a right to act according to the dictates of their conscience. The Bishops of Washington State support their claim and oppose any law or regulation that would restrict their religious liberty and prevent them from freely exercising their right of conscience.

The Washington State Board of Pharmacy unanimously voted on June 1<sup>st</sup> in favor of a proposed rule concerning pharmacists' professional responsibilities. I believe the proposed regulation struck an appropriate balance between the right of conscience and the right of patients to health care access. However, under pressure from opponents the Board members, at their July 20<sup>th</sup> meeting, agreed to review, and possibly revise, the already accepted proposal. This will be done at the next scheduled Board meeting on August 31<sup>st</sup>.

Many parishes have requested guidance on this important public policy issue. Parishes who wish to circulate petitions or write letters in favor of a pharmacist's right to conscience are encouraged to do so. These can be sent to the Governor and the Board of Pharmacy. I am providing background information developed by the Washington State Catholic Conference (WSCC) that you may wish to share with your people as a bulletin insert.

Although this week's mediation talks have not concluded on a note of finality, I am pleased to announce that the mediation talks will continue at a later date in Nevada.

You may remember that this is the second scheduled mediation. The first happened earlier this year, also in Nevada. Both mediation sessions have been conducted by Judge Gregg Zive.

I am extremely grateful for the hard work invested by so many people in this process. It is the result of months of effort on the part of victims, pastors, attorneys, and other individuals.

I hope that all people of good will might join me in praying for a successful conclusion when mediation talks begin once again.

There will be no further comment at this time.

Please pray that the mediation process will lead to healing and justice for all.
