Pope Benedict will on pilgrimage to Turkey from Nov. 28-Dec. 1. This is a very significant for dialog with the Orthodox and with Islam. The Knights of Columbus are organizing a spiritual pilgrimage with the Holy Father. Please join this pilgrimage by praying for the Pope's visit. Here is the special pilgrimage prayer, please offer this prayer each day of the pilgrimage. This is a beautiful prayer that includes points that show the bonds that exist between Catholicism and Orthodoxy, the people of Turkey and Islam. You will recognize that St Paul wrote to the Ephesians a city in modern day Turkey, and proclaimed the Gospel throughout this region. Also Mary went to live with St John, after the resurrection and divinity it is believed they lived in Ephesus, there is a house there a known as the house of Mary. The Councils of Nicea 325, Constantinople 381 are the source for the creed we pray every Sunday at Mass and the council of Ephesus 425 defended the true birth of the Son of God by approving the title for Mary: Mother of God. Please join with Catholics throughout the world in offering this prayer during the Pope's visit.

Heavenly Father from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name, we humbly ask you to sustain, inspire and protect your servant Pope Benedict XVI as he goes on pilgrimage to Turkey a land to which St. Paul brought the Gospel of your Son; a land where once the Mother of your Son, the Seat of Wisdom, dwelt; a land where faith in your Son's true was definitively professed. Bless our Holy Father, who comes as a messenger of truth and love to all people of faith and goodwill dwelling in this land so rich in history. In the power of the Holy Spirit, may this visit of the Holy Father bring about deeper ties of understanding, cooperation, and peace among Roman Catholics, Orthodox, and those who profess Islam. There will be Advent Reconciliation services at St Joseph on Tuesday evening November 28th (the Tuesday evening Mass at St Mark will be canceled for the Reconciliation Service) and at Holy Rosary on Thursday evening November 30th. For the reconciliation service at St Joseph, Fr Patrick, Fr Alex and Fr Tim from Walla Walla will be hearing confessions. For the reconciliation service at Holy Rosary Fr Pat and Fr Tim will join us. Reconciliation is a gift of grace, grace that transforms us in the secret of our hearts. You may not have received the sacrament for some time; the sacrament may seem foreign to you now. Let God love you through this sacrament and prepare you to celebrate the birth of our Savior.

On Wednesday evening, Nov. 29th at 6:30 pm at the Catholic school we will have another Code of Conduct training session in compliance with the dictates of the Diocese concerning the safety of our children. The Diocese will be subject to an audit in the next year or so to see if everyone is in compliance. All pastors, employees, and volunteers who work with children are required to go to the initial training and to update on line every year after that. If you attended the first session in '04, you need only to update on line. See Mary Fierchinger for the info. If we are not in compliance then we will not be able to work with children. The Diocese has all of us in its ETS system. Other volunteers and parish workers are encouraged, but not required to attend. Parents are encouraged to attend if you did not in '04. There is a session for children if the parents wish them to view it. Parents may sign a waiver stating that they will educate their children themselves (we did this in '04). If you have any questions about any of this please don't hesitate to ask Mary F. or Fr. Bob. Coffee and dessert will be provided. Dayton and Waitsburg will be invited to attend.

Instructional Mass
