Code of Conduct Training

On Wednesday evening, Nov. 29th at 6:30 pm at the Catholic school we will have another Code of Conduct training session in compliance with the dictates of the Diocese concerning the safety of our children. The Diocese will be subject to an audit in the next year or so to see if everyone is in compliance. All pastors, employees, and volunteers who works with children are required to go to the initial training and to update on line every year after that. If you attended the first session in '04, you need only to update on line. See Mary Flerchinger for the info. If we are not in compliance then we will not be able to work with children. The Diocese has all of us in its ETS system. Other volunteers and parish workers are encouraged, but not required to attend. Parents are encouraged to attend if you did not in '04. There is a session for children if the parents wish them to view it. Parents may sign a waiver stating that they will educate their children themselves (we did this in '04). If you have any questions about any of this please don't hesitate to ask Mary F. or Fr. Bob. Coffee and dessert will be provided. Dayton and Waitsburg will be invited to attend.

Church Steeple damage: The damage to the copper ridge cap is limited to just one section of ridge cap. One 30" piece did fly off and was retrieved; another 30" section is loose. The parish is insured by Catholic Mutual and the diocese has a loss fund. The parish is responsible for the first \$500.00 of repairs. The diocesan loss fund pays for repair costs after the deductible up to \$2,500 and Catholic Mutual is responsible for paying for repair over \$2,500. The parish does not yet have an estimate for repair
