- When a friend & their partner are together, one of them calls the other names or belittles them in front of others.
- He or she acts extremely jealous when the other talks to other boys/girls, even when it is completely innocent.
- One always apologizes for the other's behavior and makes excuses for it.
- One is always checking up on the other, calling or paging a lot, demanding where the other has been and whom they have been with.
- He or she loses their temper, maybe even breaks things of hits when they are mad.
