Celebrating Mortality

She was in her late forties and the last mammogram had indicated a lump in her left breast. The family didn't anticipate any problem and she was in very good cheer. However, when the diagnosis came, it all changed. The lump was malignant. She was suddenly faced with her mortality and the family was devastated. "I need time; I'm not ready yet" she said. That was her prayer as well.

Even the remote possibility of death scares most of us and we are thrown off balance, because we live constantly in denial of it. On the other hand, if we have a realistic awareness of our mortal nature, knowing that Jesus has freed us all who live in slavery to fear of death (Heb 2:16), it will help us focus our energies on what we are about. Then, cultivating virtues of love, compassion, sensitivity and generosity would take precedence. And when the inevitable end arrives we shall pass away peacefully without fear or regret.

As the liturgical year is winding down to a close, the Church challenges us to reflect on end things, death being an important one. All Souls' Day and the remembrance of the dead in the month of November are parts of it. Would we dare to talk about and commemorate our own mortality?

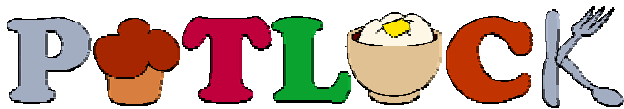

Saints of the Week

Nov 2 *The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed;* Rooted in ancient Christian tradition, st. Odilo of Cluny established a memorial of all the faithful departed in 988. It was accepted in Rome in the 13th c.

Nov 3 *Martin de Porres, religious;* † 1639; born in Lima of a Spanish father and a black slave mother; O.P. lay brother who humbly ministered to the poor and the sick, especially african slaves; devoted to the Holy Eucharist; a close friend of Rose of Lima; patron of social justice and of peoples of mixed races.

Nov 4 *Charles Borromeo, bishop;* † 3 Nov. 1584 at age 46; cardinal and secretary of state at age 22 for his uncle, Pope Pius IV; implemented reforms of Trent in his diocese of Milan; founder of seminaries; considered a model pastor by many bishops, including Francis de Sales; held five provincial councils and eleven diocesan synods; patron of catechists and of catechumens.

Vocation Views

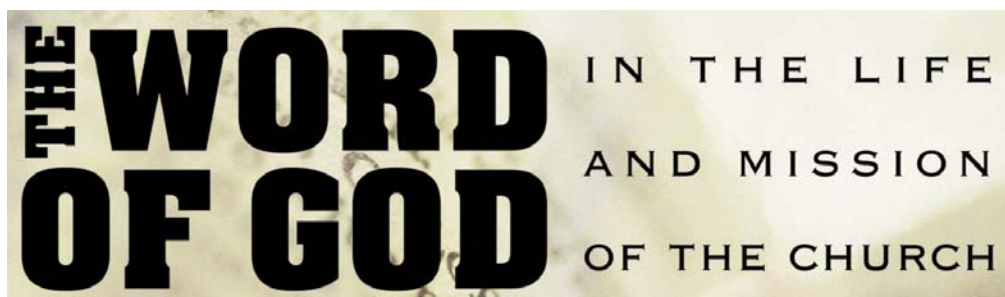
