Interior Pilgrimage

The wedding party host insisted, "You should meet this woman; she's very religious." I was introduced to a middle aged woman. "I've been to Medjugorje four times; a fifth trip is being planned" she said. I was impressed. She had also visited Fatima, Portugal. In Medjugorje the seers fascinated her and in Fatima it was the dancing sun. Her religiosity was awakened in these shrines, by participating in the services. She genuinely believed that these brought her closer to God and made her more "religious." On the other hand, she was not active in her parish community since the pastor, according to her, did not promote pilgrimages. Most of her energies and resources were spent on these trips.

Pilgrimages are of assistance if they help us to do His will and to live according to Jesus' commands. But they should not replace such a life.

Who has a strong Christian foundation? It is indeed the one who listens to the words of Jesus and acts upon them (Mtt 7:24). Christian living consists not simply in observances, rituals or even words, but in doing "the will of my Father in heaven" by allowing Jesus' word to change the way we think and act. The Gospel invites us to an interior pilgrimage to discern His will in our lives.

Saints of the Week

June 2 *Marcellinus and Peter, martyrs;* Marcellinus, presbyter, and Peter, exorcist, † c. 303; beheaded under Diocletian; both mentioned in the Roman Canon.

June 3 *Charles Lwanga and his companions, martyrs;* Charles Lwanga and twenty-one Ugandan companions, † 15 Nov. 1885 - 27 Jan. 1887; protomartyrs of Black Africa; over 100 killed in this period, including Anglicans; Charles is the patron saint of African Catholic Youth Action.

June 5 *Boniface, bishop, martyr;* † 754; Anglo-Saxon O.S.B.; founded abbey of Fulda; bishop of Mainz; martyred along with thirty companions at Dokkum in Frisia; known as the "apostle of Germany."

June 6 *Norbert, bishop;* † 1134; founded (1120) the Premonstratensians ("Norbertines"), today numbering some 1,350 members; archbishop of Magdeburg; strong supporter of Church reform and evangelization; devoted to the holy eucharist.
