Saints of the Week

June 29 *Sts Peter and Paul, apostles;* Peter, † c. 64 in Rome under Nero; Galilean fisherman; spokesman for the Twelve who became "Prince of the Apostles"; two epistles are ascribed to him; patron of those in the fishing industry.

Paul, according to tradition, was martyred in Rome c. 67; Pharisee who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles"; his letters may be dated from c. 50-65; patron of the lay apostolate, the Cursillo Movement, and Catholic Action; also of Malta and Greece.

June 30 *The First Holy Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church;* Those many Christians who were tortured, crucified, and burned alive in c. 64 in Nero's gardens on the Vatican Hill are honored today. Both the pagan writer Tacitus, in his *Annales*, and Pope St. Clement I, in this letter to the Corinthians, testify to these events.

July 1 *Blessed Junípero Serra, priest;* † 1784; from Petra, Majorca, Spain; O.F.M. missionary who arrived in New Spain in 1750; established nine of the California missions; baptized over 6,000 native peoples; recognized as a builder of the state of California; "an exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer" (Pope John Paul II).

July 3 *Thomas, apostle;* † 1st c.; his doubting gave way to faith when he saw the risen Lord; associated with founding the Church in south India; mentioned in the Roman Canon; patron of builders, India and Pakistan.

July 4 *Elizabeth of Portugal;* † 1336; named after her great-aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary; queen and mother; lover of the poor; peace-maker in the royal family; later a Franciscan tertiary; patroness of Catholic charities.

July 5 *Anthony Mary Zaccaria;* priest; BVM; † 1539 at Cremona at age 36; doctor turned priest; popular preacher who founded in Milan the Clerics Regular of St. Paul (Barnabites) for the reform of society; today they number some 400 members; sought collaboration between the clergy and the laity; promoted frequent communion.
