Parish Staff Team Opening

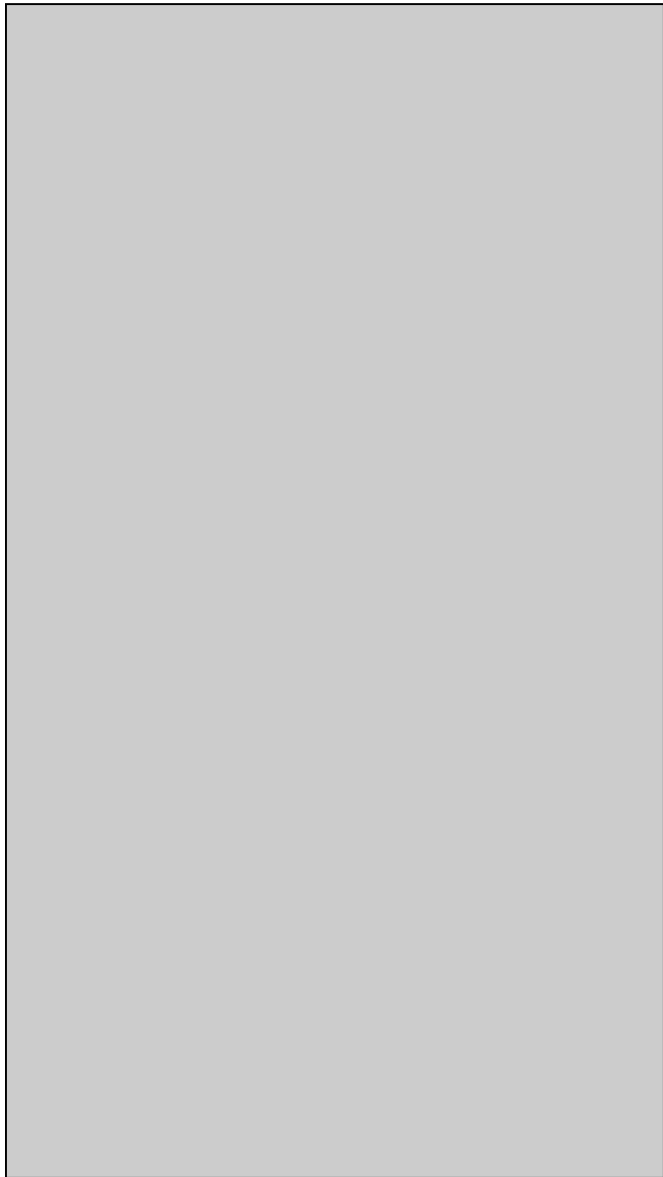

Saints of the Week

Sept 16 *Cornelius, pope, martyr; †*
253 in exile in Civitavecchia; opposed
Novatian and the rigorists in the *lapsi*
controversy; buried in the cemetery of
Callistus.

Cyprian, bishop, martyr;
decapitated 14 Sept. 258 under Valerian; ally
of Cornelius; bishop of Carthage; wrote *On
the Unity of the Catholic Church*; Cyprian
disagreed with Pope Stephen I over the
question of the rebaptism of heretics and
schismatics; first African bishop to be
martyred; patron of North Africa and of
Algeria; both mentioned in the Roman
Canon.

Sept 17 *Robert Bellarmine, bishop,
doctor; † 1621; Tuscan; brilliant Jesuit
scholar, preacher, writer, and systematic
apologist of the Counter Reformation; most
noted for his Catechism and Disputationes de
Controversis Christianae Fidei; involved in
the Galileo affair; cardinal archbishop of
Capua; patron of catechists and catechumens.*

Sept 19 *Januarius, bishop, martyr; †*
c. 305; according to his legend, thrown to
bears at Pozzuolo under Diocletian; bishop
of Benevento; as early as 1389 his blood has
liquified on thi and other days each year;
patron of Naples.

Sept 20 *Andrew Kim Taegon, priest,
martyr and Paul Chong Hasang, martyr, and
their companions, martyrs; Today we honor
103 Koreans, clergy and lay, young and old,
martyred between 1839 - 1867, including
Andrew Kim Taegon († 1846), first native
priest, and Paul Chong Hasang († 1846),
seminarian and catechist.*
