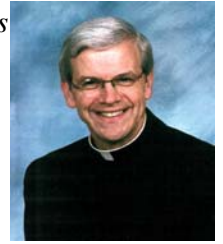

A Timely Message for Mercy. *The following letter from Cardinal Sean and other bishops was released during Holy Week. Please read it carefully and prayerfully as it appears here on Divine Mercy Sunday. Recalling God's unconditional love for all, especially the most vulnerable, we need to stand by the value of every human life, not just the strong. Governor Patrick wants "science to prevail" and supports the destruction of human embryos created just for elusive research purposes. What about ethics and the morally sound alternatives proposed by competent scientists who do not compromise their respect for human life? Read on.*



CATHOLIC BISHOPS URGE GOVERNOR TO REFRAIN FROM EXPANDING RESEARCH ON HUMAN EMBRYOS

The Roman Catholic Bishops in Massachusetts have released the following statement today, responding to the March 30 remarks of Governor Deval Patrick indicating his support for expanding destructive research on human embryos in Massachusetts:

The Governor of Massachusetts announced recently his commitment to encouraging Massachusetts scientists, possibly with the use of public funds, to create human life in the laboratory, and then to destroy the embryos for "humanitarian" research purposes. He characterized objections to this research as "ideological politics" and stated that "I want science to prevail."

The Governor minimizes the profound moral concerns at stake and attributes to science the exclusive authority to determine right and wrong. History has demonstrated that science must be governed by ethical principles rooted in the fundamental values of human dignity and sanctity of human life or it will become the engine of great destruction. Destroying human life is never humanitarian. Nor is the taking of human life necessary in the fight to find cures. Research and therapies using placental and adult stem cells continue to meet with great success without ethical cost. This is the direction that the "life sciences" should pursue.

We oppose the expansion of, and the use of taxpayer money for, any research that destroys human life. The use of public funding for unethical research that has not produced a single clinical benefit is a misuse of public monies. We call on the Governor to refrain from promoting any such policies as they are utterly inconsistent with good science and human dignity.

We encourage the Governor to support stem cell research, which respects the innate dignity of human life. Remarkable achievements have been attained by using ethical sources of stem cells, including umbilical cord blood, placental tissue and adult cells. We support stem cell research that does not endanger human life, is carried out in an ethical manner, and has been demonstrated to be effective.

OBISPOS CATÓLICOS INSTAN AL GOVERNADOR A ABTENERSE DE AMPLIAR LA INVESTIGACION CON EMBRIONES HUMANOS.

Los Obispos Católicos Romanos en Massachussets han emitido la siguiente declaración hoy, respondiendo a los comentarios del Gobernador Deval Patrick del 30 de marzo indicando su apoyo por la ampliación de la investigación de embriones humanos en Massachussets:

El Gobernador de Massachussets anunció recientemente su compromiso de alentar a científicos en Massachussets, probablemente con fondos públicos, para crear vida humana en el laboratorio, y entonces destruir los embriones con propósitos de investigación “humanitarias”. El definió sus objeciones a esta investigación como “ideologías políticas” y planteo “Quiero que la ciencia prevalezca”.

El Gobernador minimiza las profundas preocupaciones morales concernientes a apostar y atribuir a la ciencia la autoridad exclusiva de determinar lo que es correcto de lo que esta equivocado. La Historia ha demostrado que la ciencia debe ser gobernada por principios éticos enraizados en los valores fundamentales de la dignidad humana y santidad de la vida humana o se convertirá en la maquina de una gran destrucción. Destruir la vida humana nunca ha sido humanitario. Ni es necesario tomar la vida humana en la pelea para encontrar la cura de enfermedades. La investigación y terapia con el uso de la placenta y de células madres continúa encontrando gran éxito sin el costo ético. Esta es la dirección que la “vida científica” debe buscar.

Nos oponemos a la expansión y al uso del dinero de los impuestos para cualquier tipo de investigación que destruya la vida humana. El uso de fondos públicos para investigaciones no éticas que no ha producido ningún beneficio clínico es un uso indebido del dinero público. Pedimos al gobernador se abstenga de promover cualquier tipo de políticas que son totalmente inconsecuentes con la ciencia buena y la dignidad humana.

Animamos al gobernador a apoyar la investigación de las células madre, que respeta la dignidad innata de la vida humana. Logros extraordinarios han sido alcanzados por el uso ético de los recursos de las células madre, incluyendo la sangre del cordón umbilical, el tejido de la placenta y las células adultas. Apoyamos la investigación de células madre que no pone en peligro la vida humana, que se lleva a cabo de una manera ética, y de la cual ha sido demostrada su eficacia.
