Dear parishioners,

The word “cornerstone” is in my mind as I write this week’s Pastor’s column. And it’s for more than one reason!

Last weekend we had our bi-annual parish Women’s Cornerstone Retreat. This has been my third Women’s Cornerstone experience in the parish, and each one has been wonderful. It is truly inspiring to see a team of dedicated women come together each month for almost a year and work and pray so that they and all those who attend as candidates can have a faith-filled experience.

The women share their faith – they laugh, cry, listen and speak. They have times of quiet reflection, times of shared meals, times of prayer and penance, times of shared discussion ... even some time for sleep! The retreat is scheduled around several talks that the women give that focus on understanding their lives in the light of the Sacred Scriptures and their relationship with Jesus Christ and the Catholic church. Jesus Christ IS the “cornerstone” and the women encourage one another to build their lives on this solid formation!

The Eucharist is certainly the cornerstone of our faith as Catholics. While it was wonderful that our parish church was so crowded on Easter Sunday, I urge you to join me and the pastoral staff in praying that all our fellow parishioners might renew their commitment to heeding the Lord’s command to “do this in remembrance of me.” The lack of weekly participation at Mass cuts across all generations – and all regions of our nation. Let us seek to live and pray faithfully – and work to invite all people to come to know and love Jesus Christ more deeply, and unite themselves to Him in the Mass.

One immediate way of rejoicing in the gifts of faith and Eucharist is in the upcoming welcoming of many of our young people to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the first time in Holy Communion. We will celebrate the “First Communion” of our second grade candidates at the following Masses: Saturday April 12 at 5:30 p.m., Sunday April 13 at 11:30 a.m., Saturday April 19 at 5:30 p.m. and Sunday April 20 at 10 a.m. Wouldn’t it be wonderful for these children and their families to see a full church at these celebrations? We would be sharing in their joy and modeling the worship they are being invited into more deeply!

An adult funeral server is generally called upon once a month at most. Servers work together in a team of three to assist me at Mass. Servers help with the set-up of liturgical items, assist with the liturgy, and put items away after Mass. In addition, the server may be trained to become a Eucharistic Minister. Funeral Masses are generally held at 10 a.m. A server is asked to arrive at 9:30, and is usually finished by 11:30.
