PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Purpose: The Parish Pastoral Council is formed to assist the Pastor in his leadership role of planning, organizing, initiating, promoting, coordinating and reviewing parish services in the context of parish needs. The role, responsibilities and operation of the Parish Pastoral Council are defined by the Archdiocese.

Parish Pastoral Council membership is composed of the pastor and appointed pastoral staff, together with both appointed and parish-elected community members. Meetings are normally held on the third Thursday of each month from September through June in the lower Church and are open to all parishioners. Members serve three year terms with annual parish elections for one-third of the council.

PROTECTING GOD’S CHILDREN PROGRAM

Purpose: The St. Agnes Parish family is committed to ensure the safety and protection of our children from sexual abuse. The foundation of our program is a nationwide three to four hour mandatory training session required of adults who interact with St. Agnes children. This program raises the awareness and capability of parish adults in contact with our children in methods demonstrated to protect them from sexual abuse. Participants also learn to recognize warning signs that could indicate abuse and how to communicate concerns. It empowers all of us to be protectors of children. Training is offered several times each year.

ST. MATTHEW’S GUILD

Purpose: To sort, count, verify and deposit weekly offertory and special collections. There are four separate counting teams, each with four people. Each team normally serves once each month. Counting is performed per a formal “Parish Counting Procedure”, designed to provide a common consistent approach and ensure complete accuracy for all teams. Weekly tally sheets are prepared in accord with the procedure by the team leader and delivered to the Finance Council.

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

Purpose: To provide a means for St. Agnes parishioners lacking transportation or unable to drive to attend Mass. Parishioners in need of either regular or occasional rides between home and church may request them through the Transportation Committee. This new group will develop a cadre of parishioners willing to provide rides throughout the St. Agnes community and match them with those needing rides. THE FAITH EXCHANGE

Purpose: To enrich the lives and faith of people through understanding the meaning of scripture in contemporary life. The Faith Exchange ministry studies a challenging contemporary faith-related book over a six week period in the context of applicable Old and New Testament scripture; examining and interpreting the direction it brings to the conduct of our lives. These study series deepen participants' understanding of themselves as they reflect on changes they need to make in their response to life's challenges. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Purpose: For the ongoing formation of all parish members in Catholic faith and life, in the understanding of Sacred Scriptures and tradition, and in the active participation in the life and mission of the Church. Religious Education classes are provided for St. Agnes children and teens in grades 1 through 10, with preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist mostly in grade 2 and for Confirmation in grades 9 and 10. Parental sessions on these sacraments are also held in connection with their children's preparation. Catechist training using "Echoes of Faith" program is available for all teachers. The "Echoes of Faith" theological modules are also offered over a ten week period for all other St. Agnes adults, especially those in parish ministry. All adults working with children are required to attend the *Protecting God's Children Program* and must also submit a CORI form.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Purpose: Vacation Bible School is a very popular week-long annual event held during the second week of August for children from preschool through those entering fifth grade. Its purpose is to help develop their faith through creative learning activities, help prepare them to experience God's Word and to apply it their lives. The program accommodates about 85 children, has a yearly theme and teaches through scripture, prayer, age-appropriate songs, dramatized Bible stories, crafts, games, high energy music and movement. It also has an important mission project in which children learn from and celebrate helping those in need.

The program is staffed by trained adult and teen volunteers, who are always needed and essential to program success. Registration begins in late April for both children and volunteer staff. The number of children seeking registration has exceeded program capacity each year since inception. A modest fee is charged to offset program costs.

LITURGICAL MUSIC

Purpose: The mission of Liturgical Music is to enhance the liturgy with beautiful sacred music sung for the greater glory of God. This mission is carried out through our Adult and Children's Choirs, which focus on leading the congregation in songs and responses. Our repertoire contains both contemporary and traditional Christian music.

The *Adult Choir* is open to teens in seventh grade and beyond and men and women of the parish. The only requirements are a weekly commitment to sing at liturgies, the ability to sing on key, and a love of learning and singing music. Our season extends from September to June, and weekly rehearsals are held on Tuesdays at 7:00 PM in the church. The Adult Choir sings at the 10:00 AM Sunday Mass and at other Eucharistic celebrations. Rehearsals are open and interested persons may drop in at any time.

The *Children's Choir* is open to boys and girls from second through sixth grade. The season extends from September to May, and rehearsals are held twice a month on Sundays. The Children's Choir sings the first Sunday of the month at the 10:00 AM Mass. Children learn introductory skills in tonal quality, breathing, posture, and articulation, in addition to understanding the texts of the sacred songs and responses. For the fall, winter and spring seasons, the main meal is Shepherd's Pie. During the summer, egg salad is prepared and delivered with fresh bread to make sandwiches. At Christmas time, the St. Agnes Kitchen also obtains gifts for the basic needs of this community.

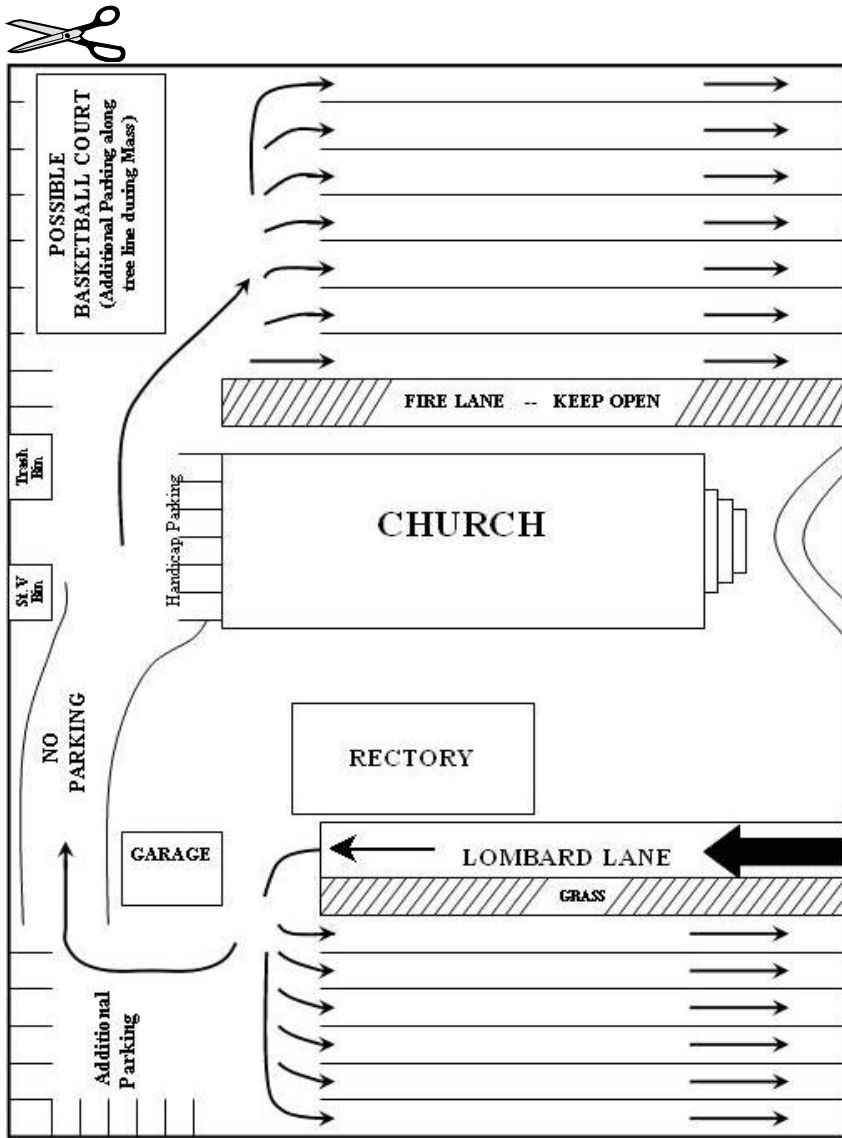
