What "Catholic" Means

The Greek roots of the term "Catholic" mean "according to (*kata-*) the whole (*holos*)," or more colloquially, "universal." At the beginning of the 2nd century, we find in the letters of Ignatius the first surviving use of the term "Catholic" in reference to the Church. At that time, or shortly thereafter, it was used to refer to a single, visible communion, separate from others.

Early Church historian J. N. D. Kelly, writes: "As regards 'Catholic,' its original meaning was 'universal' or 'general.' . . . in the latter half of the second century at latest, we find it conveying the suggestion that the Catholic is the true Church as distinct from heretical congregations. What these early Fathers were envisaging was almost always the empirical, visible society; they had little or no inkling of the distinction which was later to become important between a visible and an invisible Church" (*Early Christian Doctrines*, 190–1).

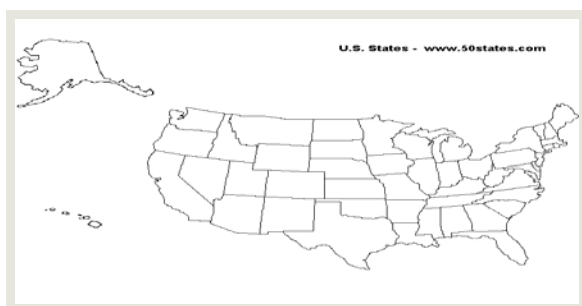
Included in the quotes below are extracts from the first creeds to use the term "Catholic"; so that the term can be seen in its historical context:

The Martyrdom of Polycarp

"And of the elect, he was one indeed, the wonderful martyr Polycarp, who in our days was an apostolic and prophetic teacher, bishop of the Catholic Church in Smyrna. For every word which came forth from his mouth was fulfilled and will be fulfilled" (*Martyrdom of Polycarp* 16:2 [A.D. 155]).

"[The Church] is called catholic, then, because it extends over the whole world, from end to end of the earth, and because it teaches universally and infallibly each and every doctrine which must come to the knowledge of men, concerning things visible and invisible, heavenly and earthly, and because it brings every race of men into subjection to godliness, governors and governed, learned and unlearned, and because it universally treats and heals every class of sins, those committed with the soul and those with the body, and it possesses within itself every conceivable form of virtue, in deeds and in words and in the spiritual gifts of every description" (*Catechetical Lectures* 18:23 [A.D. 350]).

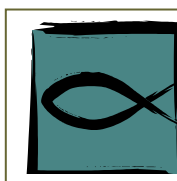

1874 was the year and UNR opened up as the University Preparatory School in Elko, NV. UNR did not officially become UNR until 1885 when the school was relocated to its present site in Reno. The next time you are walking through UNR's campus, check out Morrill Hall. It is the universities original building. In fact, UNR was modeled after the University of Virginia, whose architect was none other that our third president, Thomas Jefferson.

The university is much more that just Wolfpack basketball, or Wolfpack football. It is one of the top 150 research universities in the nation, and has on its staff one of the finest earthquake teams in the world. It also ranks in the top 10 in hydrologic schools in the world. Of course we all love to see the hardware to prove the greatness, right? The university's School of Journalism has graduated 6 Pulitzer Prize winners. As for sports, UNR is actually considered number 1 in the nation in opportunities for women in sports. With a 500 million dollar budget, UNR enrolls over 16,000 undergraduate students along with 3200 graduate students. These students can choose from about 75 bachelor's degrees and 100 graduate degrees. UNR sounds much better than UNE don't you think!

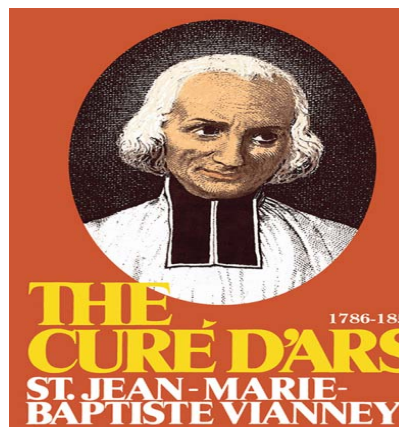
