

## Youth Activities Grades 6-12

To better serve the needs of our youth, we are being called to implement a comprehensive youth program that addresses the needs of the whole person...a process that touches not only the mind, but also the heart and soul of the young people we care for so deeply.

*The goals of the program are to:* (1) Empower and challenge our young people to live as disciples of Jesus Christ in their world today. (2) Draw our youth to responsible participation in the life, mission & work of our Catholic faith. (3) Foster the total person and spiritual growth of each young person...help them develop spiritual disciplines in their lives. (4) Evangelize our youth so that they are excited and eager to participate in their Catholic faith.

### Middle School Youth Formation

Grades 6, 7, & 8 meet for 1½ hours from 7:30-9:00 PM on Wednesdays. The extra time allows us to do more community building among the youth, and offer a greater variety of experiences and opportunities. The youth will participate in both large group and small group activities, following a rotating schedule of service and social justice activities, prayer experiences and community building activities.

### High School

Meetings include time for prayer, fun activities and discussion, life application, and occasional large group events.

**Confirmation Preparation:** Class time is 7:30-9:00 pm on Wednesday nights. Attendance for 10<sup>th</sup> grade is required. Students are confirmed in the fall of their Junior year.

**Grades 11 & 12:** Following Confirmation, youth will continue to meet in homes on either Sunday or Wednesday nights, in small faith sharing & Bible study groups.

## **Class Cancellation Policy**

If classes must be canceled because of inclement weather, the cancellation will be announced over the local radio stations. We will also send out an E-Mail to parents (if you have given us your E-Mail address). If school is dismissed early due to inclement weather, there will be no Religious Education classes that evening. If school is dismissed early for teacher in-service, classes **will** still be held.

## **Sacramental Preparation**



Sacraments, especially first sacraments, are times of joy and celebration for the entire faith community. They are graced moments in which the parish family participates and remembers its own Christian journey.

**Children are prepared to receive First Reconciliation and First Communion in the second grade. Confirmation preparation takes place in the tenth and eleventh grade.**

**Each family who has someone preparing to receive a sacrament for the first time will be asked to attend special meetings and to be actively involved in the preparation process.**

**Baptismal certificates are requested and must be kept on file for sacramental verification. Attendance at Mass, RE classes, special meetings, retreats, and service projects is expected.**

If a child enters our program in grades 3-12 who has not received First Communion or Reconciliation, please notify the Religious Education Office and we will arrange for preparation and reception of these sacraments.

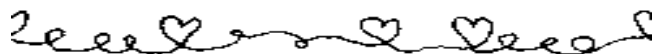
## Student Expectations

**Students are expected to show respect for grounds, building, classrooms, catechists and other students:**

- Fighting, pushing or intimidating behavior will not be allowed.
- Language that is disrespectful will not be tolerated.
- Walking inside the building and the use of moderate voices in the hallways and classrooms will be expected.
- Classroom rules established by individual teachers are to be followed.
- No ipods, cell phones, or other electronic devices are to be used during class time.
- Respectful behavior is expected at all gatherings in the Church. This respect includes appropriate participation and no disruptive or distracting behavior.
- Students are expected to come to class on time and prepared with the assignments that are due.

**If a student does not follow expectations:**

- 1. Catechist talks to student privately about misbehavior.
- 2. Repeat of behavior will result in dismissal from the classroom, with the textbook, to the RE office. Rachel Mark or Deb Gilk will contact parents if needed.
- 3. If the problem is not corrected and the parents need to be contacted a second time, parents will be asked to sit in on the class or to instruct the student at home to keep up with lessons.
- 4. Parents can obtain permission from Rachel Mark or Deb Gilk to have student return to class when they believe the misbehavior will not continue.



## General Guidelines

The Religious Education Program blends the needs and concerns of the families of St. Thomas More with the learning expectations and sacramental opportunities of the larger Church community.

Within the classroom, the children are offered experiences in prayer, scripture, doctrine and faith sharing. Inspired by the Good News, they are guided and encouraged in various opportunities to serve in family, parish and community.

Classes are scheduled on Wednesdays. Please consult the Religious Education calendar to know which days there are classes and other special events.

The curriculum is based on the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* to ensure that the Christian Message is presented in its entirety and richness. The texts selected are in conformity to the Religious Education Curriculum Guidelines mandated by the Bishop. Our program is currently using the Sadlier “We Believe” series for Pre-School through Grade 6. Look for the Sharing Faith with My Family pages to be sent home and visit the program Web site [www.webbelieveweb.com](http://www.webbelieveweb.com) for family-based faith activities to share.

Students are expected to observe the rules of conduct that enhance the religious learning experience. Parents or guardians will be contacted in the event a catechist or staff member deems it necessary. Every attempt will be made to settle any difficulty in a Christian manner.

Children and their families are encouraged to attend Sunday Mass on a regular basis. It is in this way that the children learn to participate in the liturgy as well as having the experience of the larger parish community.



## Catechists

Because effective catechesis depends so heavily on the faith, hope, and love of our catechists – we celebrate and express our deepest gratitude for everyone who serves the parish as catechists. They help to plant the seeds of faith that will continue the mission of Jesus. We are aware of the efforts catechists make to be faithful instruments of God’s Word and the personal sacrifices they make to teach in the name of Christ and the Church. All of our Catechists are volunteers and without their many hours of love and devotion, this program could not exist. Many of our catechists have students in the program. We are also indebted to those who teach who do not have children in the program, who generously give of their time and talent.

## Book Fees

There is a fee charged for the cost of the student books. The fee is \$20.00 per child or \$45.00 per family (3 or more students). Book fees are due upon the start of religious education classes.

## Attendance

Regular attendance at religion classes on all grade levels is essential to the continuity and reinforcement of the religious education experience. This implies arriving on time, being attentive during class time, participating and cooperating with teachers.

Attendance is taken each week. If a student cannot be present for a session, a parent or guardian **must notify the office by phone** prior to, or on the day of the scheduled class. **If we do not receive a call, the office will call your home to ensure the whereabouts and safety of students.** Students will not be allowed to leave class early without written consent from a parent or guardian.

## Policy for Parental Involvement

The parish religious education programs we offer are meant to support the parents in their responsibility as the first educators of the faith. Family involvement in and commitment to the life of the parish is critically important for those who participate in parish religious education.

Parents will assist in the faith growth and development of their children by encouraging regular class attendance, family prayer and weekly Mass attendance as a family. Participation in Christian service activities as a family also reinforces the principles of the Stewardship way of life.

### Parents are also encouraged to:

- ◆ Participate as a volunteer catechist, substitute, classroom aide, youth formation activities, office helper, assist with the Food & Fellowship suppers, or be a hallway monitor.
- ◆ Meet your child’s teacher and know what your child is learning. Help your child show appreciation to their teacher throughout the course of the year.
- ◆ Help your child with assigned homework and classroom projects. Have conversations with your child about faith and life issues.
- ◆ Attend gatherings or special events connected with the program.
- ◆ Encourage your child’s participation in broader parish and diocesan events when they are available. These kinds of activities help to expand a young person’s experience of what it means to be part of a church community.
