## GRAND KNIGHT'S REPORT

### Grand Knight's Report

This new fraternal year I have struggled to get myself "wound up" and running with a full head of steam. It has seemed sort of "anti-climactic". I believe that is because last year we had to deal with the issue of our financial crisis and future use of the building. That crisis has, for the time being, been dealt with. We are not "rich" by any stretch of the imagination, but we have averted a complete fiscal "meltdown". My point is, I, we, need to find us another issue to focus on-something to occupy our time and energy.

Brothers, that new focus and goal should be to recruit and bring in new Knights. I have pushed this agenda before and we had some success last year, recruiting 19 new Knights. This year we set a goal of recruiting 22 new Knights. That goal is still attainable, and then some! We need not divert energies from our other programs, which are numerous. But, imagine how much more easily we can accomplish our program and charity goals with more new, energized Knights standing shoulder to shoulder with us. Many of our more "experienced" knights are looking for just such a boon-someone to pass the mantle to.

I want every eligible Catholic man over the age of 18 to be asked or invited to join our cause. I

need knights with Form 100's in their hands, asking every man at every mass, during the month of October, if he is a Knight. It only takes four words to open the conversation: "Are you a Knight?" If he is, great, invite him to the next meeting or to help in the next event. If he answers "No, I'm not", there is your opportunity to talk about the Knights of Columbus. I am asking our Membership Director, Brother Herb Baker, to prepare a "dialogue guide" for those who find speaking and "selling" a challenge. It will help you present the Knights positively and to respond to questions they may have. I like the one Past Grand Knight Mike Kassinger has offered when a gentleman answered "No" to the question; "You know, joining the Knights is by invitation only." He then continues to enlighten the prospective candidate on the rewards and benefits of accepting the invitation to join our honorable fraternity.

In the August 21<sup>st</sup> issue of the Knight Line there is a Program Supplement on recruitment. Read it. Basically, the "more they know, the more they'll want to join". It suggests involving wives in the recruitment effort. Often, the wife has some better idea as to the benefits offered by membership in the Knights of Columbus.

Many of us struggle with finding a way to focus our energies and devotion to our faith. The Knights of Columbus is a great way to fulfill that need within ourselves to offer something positive to our parish and community of faith. *(Con't on Page 3)*

We will be scheduling a special 24 hour Knights vigil on Saturday, October 25th, from 6 AM Saturday to 6 AM Sunday, at the Abortion Clinic on 9th Avenue. Please let me know if you are willing to volunteer for a two hour (or more) block of time, and what time you prefer. Father Nicholas will be joining us at the clinic at 10:30 PM that night for a special service. We will be praying for all the souls of those who are lost at the clinic, the children who are killed there, as well as their parents. We will also be praying for the abortionists and their staff who do the killing.

Fifty children are killed every week in Pensacola. During the 40-day vigil some people turn back, simply because someone is there visibly praying for them. Some have told us this directly, others we hear about afterward, indirectly. Come and pray to save a child's life. Christ reminds us that whatever we do for the least of these, our brothers, we do for Him. As Knights, let us do this for Him..

## OPEN LETTER TO SENATOR JOE BIDEN ON ABORTION

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson sent an open letter to Senator Joseph Biden on Friday, September 19, challenging the assertion of the vice presidential candidate that Catholic teaching on abortion is not clear. The letter was published in USA Today, The Washington Times, Philadelphia Inquirer and Wilmington News Journal, among others.

Writing "as a fellow Catholic layman," Anderson said that "statements that suggest that our Church has anything less than a consistent teaching on abortion are not merely incorrect; they may lead Catholic women facing crisis pregnancies to misunderstand the moral gravity of an abortion decision."

Anderson noted that the founders of the United States "believed that we are 'endowed by [our] creator with certain unalienable rights,'" and that first among these is 'life,'" and he appealed to Biden, "as a Catholic who acknowledges that life begins at conception, to resolve to protect this unalienable right."
