LEGAL BRIEFS

Did you know that every time you pay your dues, 5% of that goes into the K of C Building Fund? Now, 5% of our nominal membership fee is not very much. It is used to "keep a roof over our heads" at the Knight's Hall. Over the past two years, we have had some cash outlays for hurricane repairs, interior maintenance, new speakers for the sound system, etc. We have just found out that our insurer for the building is dropping us effective March 2007. That means we can expect to pay some \$2-5 thousand more per year just to get insurance on the building. Where is that coming from? Good question! It can only come out of any income we produce at our programs – or donations. May I suggest a one-time donation from any member – you can include it in your next dues check, just state that you want the extra money to go to the building fund. We can always make donations to the council. When your dues come up next year, remember to put in a little extra for the building fund. As we all know, nobody's insurance around here has dropped their rates – only dropped our policy!!

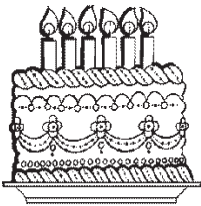

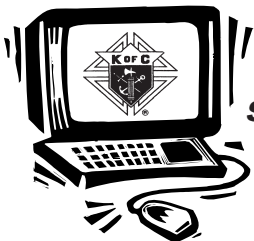
