

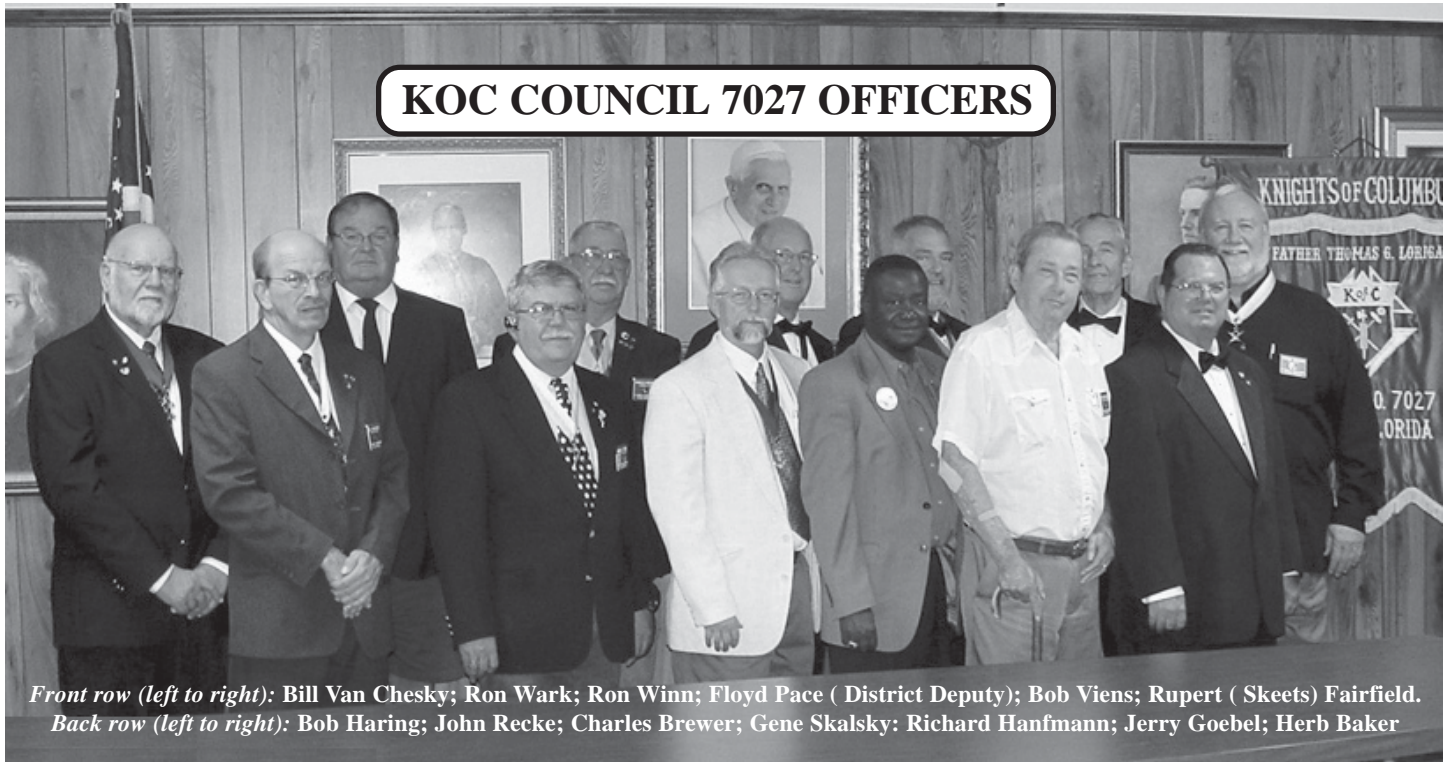

## CCMI

---

This month has been interesting. In our efforts to get the Hall ready to rent to the public, we ran into serious issues with the local Fire Department. Specifically, there are numerous violations and shortcomings that must be corrected before we can truly begin renting out the building. In short, the projected costs of the upgrades to the building will total over \$12,000.00. When you tack on the marketing and advertisements needed to get the word out about our facility, new kitchen equipment needed to properly serve catered meals to meet customer demands, the total exceeded \$25,000.00. This was a conservative estimate. That amount is fully half of the money we have in the bank as our “self insurance” in case of a hurricane or other major event. Remember, we have no insurance on the building except liability. After expending this money, there is still no guarantee of any income to make it back. We will be financially insolvent in about 6 to 8 months. The CCM Board of Directors voted to pursue, with all due diligence, a long term lease with an outside entity.

When this information was presented at the April council meeting, they also voted to pursue a long term lease. The fact is, this building was constructed to be an income generator. If other options are unavailable, the pursuit of a long term lease makes sense. Use the building to our advantage. It is a tool, a means to an end. Our goal is to support our council who takes care of our brothers and widows in distress and our charitable organizations in need of our help. We will keep you apprised as things develop and unfold.

---

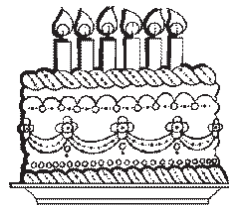
*Brother Knights:*
